Today's Program.....

Gordon Beeman introduced our speaker **Beth Adams**, who is Director of both the Ann Arbor Meals On Wheels Program and the Housing Bureau for Seniors at the University of Michigan Health System. Beth noted that in the next 10-20 years the number of seniors that will require special assistance is expected to double. This will affect programs like Meals On Wheels as well as Senior Housing Issues. Kiwanians are involved heavily in the Meals On Wheels program for which great appreciation was expressed. More than 400 meals are delivered daily and in some cases two meals per individual are involved. There is no charge although voluntary donations are accepted. (Donations average about 57 cents per meal.) In the next few years the program hopes to offer "optional" meals such as vegetarian for those with a preference. Those who receive meals are grateful and have commented on its importance to them: better nutrition; enjoyable interaction with the deliverers making for a brighter day; makes life easier; and just knowing food is coming can be a relief. With regard to the Housing Bureau for Seniors, there are several related components. These relate to individuals who are having problems with income, paying utilities, eviction, foreclosure, family complications, etc. One of the programs relates to home sharing whereby individuals are paired up taking into account common interests and need for companionship, willingness to do certain chores in return for lower rent, etc. There are often problems relating to hoarding, clutter, and cleanliness that make for a significant challenge. The organization interacts with other social agencies and city programs.
