Today's Program...

Don Kossik provided a brief overview of our clubs K-Family involvement: **Bill Tasch** as advisor to the K-Kids group at Angell Elementary, **Peter Schork** as Advisor to the Key Club's at Pioneer and Huron High Schools (**Peter** is looking for a volunteer to share this responsibility), **Bill Hallock** is working with the Aktion Club at



WISD and Circle K is served by Bill Tasch, Don Clewell and Don Kossik.

Don then introduced 2013-2014 Officers of the UofM Circle K club: Josh Kurtz, Candace Elmquist and Jonathan Pevarnek. Each walked us through aspects of community involvement in which their club has been active.

Candace has been working as a K-Kids coordinator for 25 children. She leads them in weekly 45 minute hands on projects and has coached them through two fund raisers: Trick or Treat for Unicef (~\$63) and one for C.S. Mott Children's hospital (~\$1,125 in only 5 days!). She went on to explain how they also work with the Whitmore Lake Builders Club and the Aktion Club as well as volunteering at our Thrift Sale on a regular basis.

Their big projects include: Serv-A-Thon, which will take place January 25th 2014 from 9:30 AM to 3:30 PM, with a Clue Murder Mystery Theme and Service Day. Service Day is a 24 hour event and was completed November 16th 2013. 120 service projects were completed while providing 2,300 hours of service!

Josh went on to explain other fund raising activities: *Pieing Leadership*: Tickets are sold to see select Circle K Leaders catch a pie in the face! \$500 was raised for Eliminate. Zack's "Hair" fund raiser (those attending our regular meeting remember Zack's *formerly* long locks) also generated \$500+ for Eliminate.

A program new this year which Josh was pleased with, has been the development of long term volunteer positions, which has provided deeper relationships and connections to projects in which they are involved.

Additional fund raisers for Eliminate Jonathan mentioned, include the Spaghetti Dinner, shared jointly with our club and the Formal Fun Dance.

Jonathan then covered how their club (the largest in the U.S.) is involved with more than just our immediate locale: Attending the International Convention in Vancouver and build-



ing playgrounds in the area while there, the Holiday Embrace which takes place in January for Sub Region 'C' (a collection of states and regions around the central United States) and doing interclubs with other Circle K Clubs throughout the state.

The three of them conveyed their commitment to Circle K and Kiwanis and they expressed their appreciation of the help Kiwanis has provided in making their club successful!


