Back in the September 23<sup>rd</sup> newsletter we promised you a more detailed history of our club's exchange program with the Blenheim Ontario Club. Well, thanks to Max Ziegler here it is...

The Club exchange started in the late 50's. Member and Michigan District President Ralph Keys was asked to speak at the then annual US/Canada Goodwill Program in Windsor. Chuck Gregory, Murray Wanty, and Walt Springer—Sheridan Springer's father—accompanied him. One of these men made a contact with members of the Blenheim Club and our club was invited over in February each year for curling and fellowship. We would take a bus load of Kiwanis members and guests with a little beer and leave Ann Arbor around 8:30AM. We would arrive in Blenheim and proceed to the hotel. From there half of our members went to the liquor store to stock up, and 1/4 went to the meat market to buy Canadian bacon and the rest stayed at the hotel, played cards, and visited. About noon a member of the Blenheim club got us and we all went to their meeting hall for lunch. Then we went to the curling hall for an afternoon of curling; usually two or three Americans and one Canadian to show us how on each team. This was all followed by their meeting and dinner.

On one of our bus trips, one of the Ontario Provincial Police Officers boarded the bus. He quickly told the driver that stopping him was a joke, asking him to play along, before entering the bus to check us for illegal beer. Later we learned that the officer Arnold Rundel was the President of the Blenheim Club.

Our club then invited the Blenheim Club to join us for a day of golf and fellowship followed by a meal. We started at Inverness Golf Course, which was a nine hole inexpensive course. Sheridan Springer was very involved while at Inverness as it was a private club and no cart rental. We moved to Pierce Lake shortly after it opened primarily because of cart availability. The Blenheim Club folded in the mid-nineties. We tried to find another Canadian Club to exchange with but to no avail. The club had to make a decision; do we keep the day as a fun day or do we stop having the event. I and several others were in favor of continuing the event as a fun day and that's the way it has been for the last 15 years. There were several years when we made it a fundraiser for either Motts Children's Hospital or the Michigan Foundation but it has mainly been a Fun Day with the proceeds helping to fund other free club activities; i.e. Christmas Party, lunches for volunteers and members before the annual Christmas Sale


