Today's Program...

Claire Dahl introduced Dave Hartmann who is Mentor-in Residence for the U of M's Tech Transfer program and an advisor to various programs at the U of M's Ross School of Business. He grew up in Jackson and attended Western Michigan University where he earned both a BA and an MA in Electrical Engineering. Not bad for a guy whose junior high counselor told him he wasn't college material. After graduating from Western, he worked first for Sycor and then for Nortel, a Canadian company with facilities in Ann Arbor. Nortel became a major player in the telecommunications industry in 1984 when Ma Bell was broken up into 7 regional phone companies. When Nortel closed its Ann Arbor facility in 1999, Mr. Hartmann started his own company, Avail Networks, which developed



routing and switching equipment for the telecommunications industry. Mr. Hartmann said that when you start your own business you need to create something of value and be willing to take a huge risk as many start-ups fail. Getting people to believe in what you are doing is essential to raising the capital for high-tech start-ups. When the tech bubble burst in 2001, Avail "pivoted" (changed directions) to building 3G and 4G networks for cell phones. In 2003, Avail and a French company with which it had partnered were both poised to be acquired by Verizon but then the Iraq war broke out and Verizon decided that was not a good time to acquire a French company. Hartmann ultimately sold Avail to ERI (Eastern Research). He said that it is good that the State of Michigan is now investing in local start-ups and that there are 20 venture capital companies based in Ann Arbor. He sees the US as more competitive now than in the recent past because the US is really good at innovation and because wages in other countries are catching up with US rates.
