Today's Program.....



Cheryl provided an overview of the structure, functions, and financial aspects of the community foundation. Founded in 1963 the AAACF is one of the largest of Michigan's 65 community foundations; currently managing about \$70 million in assets. The foundation spends up to 5% of its assets each year supporting a broad range of cultural, economic, and human services programs aimed at improving life throughout our community. AAACF provides a structured way for individuals to make donations, establish a legacy fund, or support favorite causes. The foundation can



handle almost any type of donation whether in cash, securities, real and personal property, or bequests. More information about the AAACF is available at http://www.aaacf.org/.




