

Today's Program.....

Betsy Ford introduced Missy Orge from Food Gatherers who told us about their Community Kitchen program. Food Gatherers started in 1988 with a goal of alleviating hunger in Washtenaw County. Their overall mission distributed about six million pounds of food last year in support more than 150 other non profit organizations in the area who provide food for the needy, for example Hope Clinic and the Salvation Army. The daily Community Kitchen at the Delonis Center is their only direct food delivery program. Missy told us more about their job training program for 17 – 21 year olds. They enroll 8 – 16 youth in each of two six week sessions per year. Students learn to plan, prepare, serve and clean up after meals for the Delonis homeless. About 90% of the program grads go on to either college or employment, some in the food service industry. Food Gatherers has a 24 person paid staff including 7 truck drivers. In addition, about 5500 volunteers helped out just in the last year. They are upgrading their warehouse to improve storage of seasonal produce and healthy food.


