Today's Program.....


Dave Drake introduced Mark Braun, better known as Mr. B., Ann Arbor's best known blues pianist. Mark grew up in Flint and his father and grandfather were both Presidents of the Flint Kiwanis Club. He has been playing piano since he was 17, and learned from Boggie Woogie Red and others that played at the Blind Pig or the Blues and Jazz Festival. Mr. B always plays at the Ann Arbor Art Fair and similar venues. He is promoting piano playing through a 90 day, 1900 mile bicycle trip from the headwaters of the Mississip-



pi River to New Orleans starting next September. Mark said that pedaling uphill is a real challenge, but they average 30 miles a day. The bicycle or large tricycle will be pulling a 350 pound piano the entire way. There is a team of 30-40 people working to plan and organize the trip at a cost of around \$90,000. Mark is trying to raise most of the money in advance as he is planning many free shows and benefits along the way.
