Cliff Sheldon introduced Ann Arbor Mayor John Hieftje. John came to Ann Arbor at the age of 9 months, graduated from Pioneer High and EMU, and has been Mayor since 2000. Mayor Hieftje gave a "State of the City" message and told us that Ann Arbor is in good shape. The city is financially strong with a small surplus expected this year. Employees have been cut from 1004 to 608 in the last nine years with minimal reductions in service. The quality of life is highly rated because of the U-M, a strong downtown, numerous parks and a variety of cultural activities. Companies like Barracuda and




Google are bringing young high tech workers to the downtown. Congestion will be increasing and we must need to plan for it now. The wastewater treatment plant is being rebuilt at a cost of \$120,000,000.

John also answered several questions and said he would look into the possibility of Kiwanis receiving a discount of the landfill dumping fees we pay in light of our recycling efforts.


