Jim Wolfington introduced Howdy Holmes, President and CEO of Chelsea Milling Company. Howdy is the fourth generation owner of the company that started as a flour mill and is now the market leader of prepared baking mixes. Jiffy Mix was developed and named by Howdy's grandmother in 1930 and is so easy to use "that a man can do it." Howdy said that Jiffy Mix doesn't advertise or use coupons and is able to pass the savings along to the customer. They give plant tours and Claire Dahl modeled her Jiffy Mix t-shirt. Howdy talked about the challenges of adapting an organization to changing times, and briefly spoke about his career as an Indy car driver. That was a childhood dream that he achieved and was the Indy rookie of the year in 1987. Everyone took home a box of Jiffy Mix as a reminder of an excellent talk and a great local product.

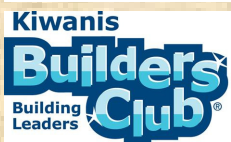
