Today's Program.....

Amanda Mercer and Bethany Williston described the efforts of six former collegiate swimmers to organize an all-female relay team to swim the English Channel---England to France and back---to raise awareness of ALS (amyotrophic lateral sclerosis) disease. They were inspired to honor a friend who recently had been diagnosed with ALS. Planning began in the summer of 2009. The team had formed by the summer of 2010, and it chartered a pilot whose boat and expertise would be needed to

make the round-trip crossing. During its training, the team needed to spend some time swimming in cold water because Channel water is normally about 60F. To pass the test required to qualify for the

Channel swim, each team member had to show that she could swim for two hours in 62F water. Finding water this cold during the training period was a challenge. Later challenges to be faced included choppy water, adverse current, the neap tide, seasickness in the boat, patches of seaweed harboring jellyfish, hyperventilation, and swimming in the dark (the round trip exceeded 18 hours). Amanda had a special challenge: in March 2012 she was diagnosed with breast cancer. A couple of week after having completed seven bouts of chemotherapy, she and the others team members left for England. (Amanda completed radiation




treatments after the swim, and is now free of cancer.)

As the time to begin the swim drew near, the swimmers briefly experienced the thought that perhaps they were being selfish for drawing attention to themselves. A timely letter from the friend who had inspired their undertaking made them realize that they were doing something worthwhile. On 27 July 2012, they began the crossing from England at about 5:30 a.m. The two official observers in the boat ensured that the swimmers obeyed all the rules. (Goggles and caps are permitted, but not wetsuits. Grease is permissible but messy.) The officials gathered lots of data: continual GPS positions, tides, water temperature, arm strokes per minutes, etc. After the team reached the French shore, the pilot encouraged them by saying that the swim back to England was "all downhill." 



The Channel swim was every bit as difficult as they thought it would be, especially the cold water. When the final swimmer approached the English shore, friends and family held up their lighted cell phones to mark where she should exit. They beat the 2007 world record, held by a team from Mexico, by 4 minutes! (Later, a member of that Mexican team sent them a congratulatory message.) Amanda said that fewer people have swum the Channel than have climbed Mt. Everest.

The financial goal of the team is to raise \$120,000 for ALS research; so far, it has raised \$96,400. The World Premier of the documentary "Swimming Toward A Cure" will be held Sunday, 10 February, at 1:00 p.m. at U of M Blau Auditorium (free parking).
