Today's Program.....

Today's speaker was Dick Lawrence, who retired from the EPA National Vehicle and Fuel Emission Laboratory in Ann Arbor in 2001, where he was director of engineering operations and later championed a major facility renovation. After retirement his interest in flying increased and led to his current cause, Kid's Wings which he formed in 2004. Dick related how he and many other volunteer pilots with privately owned airplanes play a pivotal role in transporting patients, especially children, to distant medical facilities to receive specialized medical treatment. Kid's Wings is 501(c)3 non-profit organization formed to facilitate fund-raising for the program. Our Community Services Committee contributed \$2250 this past year. The cost per flight is about \$500 and there are substantial other costs including a \$20,000 engine overhaul for his




Cherokee Arrow. Dick has flown over 200 missions, mostly for children. He was on the front page of the Detroit Free Press on 9/17/2012, headlining an article describing the free flight program. In 2011 pilots flew roughly 46,100 missions in all 50 states.

Kid's Wings operates to provide flights. They are linked to the coordinating agencies Angel Flight, Air Lifeline, and Lifeline Pilots, which administrate the flights but do not provide planes or pilots. Sometimes distances are so great that a patient may take 2 or more flights to reach the specialist needed for their (usually rare) condition. Angel Flight also coordinates flights for organ transplants patients and Dick has flown many of these.


