Today's Program.....


Jerry Brown introduced our speaker Kim Barnes Arico, women's basketball coach at the University of Michigan. Joining her was Sarah VanMeter, Assistant Director for Public and Media Relations. Coach Arico just completed her first season at UM with a 22 and 11 season and took the team to the second round of the NCAA tournament. She got off to a record start at 15 and 2 (4 and 0 in the Big10). She joined UM after spending 10 years at St. Johns, where she built that program into a national power and one of the elite teams in the Big East. She came to Michigan because she believes it has one of the best overall athletic and academic programs in the nation; and the current facilities are second to none. She is



thrilled at the welcome she has received by her players and the community and was pleased to show off her shoes, which were maize ("not yellow"). This year the team lost (graduated) a number of its best players, but Coach Kim is very optimistic about the future and the way recruiting is going. The team is getting ready for a foreign trip to play several teams in Europe. The trip should be a great bonding experience for the team and should indicate how the coming season may go. Kim is happy with her all new coaching staff that come with excellent credentials for play at this level. Despite being relatively small, Coach Arico was a highly successful basketball player in college (graduating from Montclaire State), where she was captain and leading scorer during her junior and senior years. She has a son (11) and two daughters (7 and 5).
