Today's Program.....


Al Gallup introduced our speaker Susan Hutton, a writer and representative of the "Ann Arbor No Idle Campaign". Susan noted that the average driver is responsible for 4-10 minutes of idling (their car) daily. This wastes a lot of gas and is collectively responsible for the emission of 100 billion pounds of carbon dioxide into the atmosphere every year. Car exhaust also contains a number of pollutants that can make people sick -- especially children in whom asthma is believed to be aggravated. It was stated that 12% of children in Ann Arbor have asthma, which is twice the national average. Examples of unnecessary idling are: running the car while



stopped at an ATM; excessively warming up the car in the morning; and waiting to pick up the kids at school or soccer practice while keeping the engine going to maintain the heat in the winter or air-conditioning in the summer. It is recommended that people use the "ten second rule" by which if idling is necessary for more than 10 seconds, the engine should be shut off; however, turning of the engine while stopped at a traffic light is discouraged for safety reasons. It was claimed that the overall effort should not only save gas but also lower pollution, and impact climate change.


