Today's Program.....

Steve Pezda introduced our own Mike Dabbs and Sherry Springer, whose topic was "Michigan's No Fault Insurance" program. All cars in Michigan are required to have basic insurance coverage in order to get license plates and qualify for "no fault insurance". It is against the law not to have such insurance. This was adopted in 1973 and limits rights to sue; however drivers and passengers are covered for all reasonable charges for as long as deemed necessary. The program provides the best health benefits in the country regarding personal injury protection (PIP). It was noted that 2/3 of such expenses relate to brain injuries. Overall, 19.5% of drivers in the state do not have insurance coverage. In Detroit this level is 50%. Insurance in Detroit costs close to 3 times what we pay in Ann Arbor. The game is for many to buy a 7-day policy in order to purchase plates and then let it expire. The rest of us end up paying for the coverage indirectly. There is a new proposal to put a \$1 million cap on what the state will pay. It appears that this will not pass. 


