## Today's Program.....

Dori Edwards spoke on the subject of medical marijuana (MM). She was introduced by Joan Masters. Dori has long been a believer in natural foods and medicines. She abhors pesticides and fears pharmaceuticals. Dori has been deeply involved in MM advocacy since about 2009, shortly after Michigan voters overwhelmingly passed the Michigan MM Act (MMMA) approving its use. She gave a brief history of hemp and related plants, all of which are illegal to grow in the US, per federal law. Dori says the law was passed to please large industrial competitors. The US is now the #1 importer of hemp products. If the restriction were removed, Michigan agriculture could benefit greatly.

The use of cannabis is referred to in the Hebrew bible.

The plant in all its varieties has several hundred uses.

Henry Ford is said to have used hemp products exclusively, to fashion a car interior. George Washington was a grower and probable user. Cannabis was the 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup>

most widely used medicine in the US in the 1800's. There are many active compounds. Tetrahydrocannabinol (THC) is the main one for psychoactive effects but other cannabinoids (CBD's) are important for medicinal effects. Dori says that one can get most/all the medicinal effects from products with CBD's but little THC, so they are true medicines. Plants can also be grown with high THC concentrations, as is often the case, to maximize psychic effects for social use.

Dori met with many attorneys seeking interpretation of the MMMA of 2008. In 2008 she opened Treecity Health Collective on State Street (now located at 2730 Jackson Avenue, ph. 734-369-3212). She is very interested in advocating high standards for the industry. A Dr.'s recommendation is required to obtain the medicine. Treecity has a Dr. on site one day/week. She hopes Treecity will be recognized as Best in State and be chosen as a model. She has visited many other dispensaries and organized the best ones into the Ann Arbor MM Cannabis Guild of which she is vice-president. The goal is maximize their impact of the future course on this issue.
