### Today's Program.....


Today's speaker, introduced by John Sampselle, was Hilda Alcindor, BA, RN, Dean of the Faculté des Sciences Infirmières de l'Université Episcopale d'Haïti (FSIL nursing school). Ms. Alcindor also serves on the Board of Directors of the Haiti Nursing Foundation; a Michigan corporation organized for the purpose of supporting the advancement of nursing in the Republic of Haiti. The focus of this support is on nursing education, especially on the FSIL nursing school in Léogâne, Haiti. The FSIL currently has 104 nursing students enrolled, and three of those are sponsored by the Kiwanis Club of Ann Arbor. Haiti has only about 2,500 hospital beds for a population of 10 million and the earth-



quake recovery has been slow. The need is great for professionally trained nurses and other lasting and sustainable aid programs. As Dean Alcindor said, the people need to be taught fishing, not given a fish. 
