Today's speaker, introduced by **Claire Dahl** was Brenda Bentley, Author of Riverwalks Ann Arbor (available at Nicola's and other Ann Arbor booksellers, more info at http://www.citywalks.us/ index.html). Ms. Bentley is working on a new book, tentatively titled Woodward Avenue Walks, covering the full 27-mile length of Woodward Avenue from the Detroit River to the City of Pontiac. Woodward Avenue follows an old Indian trail and the development along its course chronicles much of the history of southeast Michigan from the early glory days of Detroit and the auto industry, through the later development of the city, and on to suburban growth. 


standing examples of Art Deco design can be found in the buildings along the route, and cultural and architectural gems abound for the looking. Woodward Avenue has been designated an "All American Road" and A "Blue Star Memorial Highway" in recognition of its historical significance.

One more thing... Brenda meant to remind us that Kiwanis was founded, in 1915, at the old Griswold Hotel, one block from the famous Guardian Building and one block west of Woodward. If people take her historic Woodward stroll, they can salute the beginnings of Kiwanis!
