Today's Program.....


Today's speaker, introduced by **Phil Chen**, was Henry Aldridge (no relation to the Henry Aldrich of old-time radio fame). Dr. Aldridge is the Head Organist at the Michigan Theater and has been involved with the theater's historic Barton pipe organ since 1970. The organ's history goes back to 1927 when it was installed during the construction of the theater. Originally used to accompany silent films the organ fell into disuse and suffered water damage between 1950 and 1970. A restoration was completed from 1970-72 with regular usage resuming in '72. The restored organ served as a catalyst for saving the entire Michigan Theater when it was threatened with demolition in 1978.



Some 7,000 theater organs were manufactured but only 300 or so survive. About 50 of these are in theaters, 20-30 are active, and only six to ten of those are played regularly like the one at the Michigan Theater. The organ is played five days per week by a five organists on a rotating schedule. It is played before movies; is used for weddings, receptions, and other special events; and is used with the Ann Arbor Symphony and Civic Band. Perhaps a Kiwanis fundraiser featuring the organ and a movie sing-along is in our future?


