Today's Program.....


Jim Carey introduced our speaker, Don Granato, coach of the 1996 birth year (17 year old) USA Hockey team. Don was accompanied by Jake Wesolek, Director of PR and Marketing. Coach Don filled us in on an outstanding youth hockey program located at the A2 Ice Cube right here in Ann Arbor. This developmental program for 17 and 18 year olds from across the country started 16 years ago. The program main office is in Colorado Springs but the training operation is here. Eight scouts tour the country looking for the best of the best young ice hockey players. About 22 young men per age year (16-17 and 17-18) move to Ann Arbor full time to live with a local family, attend Pioneer High School, and play hockey in the National Team Development Program. Their daily schedule is: To PHS school at 7:00a, class till about 1:30p, then training in hockey class, on the ice and in the



weight room until about 6p. They go home for dinner with their host family, homework and curfew at 9:00p. Don noted that as a group their PHS grade point average is 3.5! Don went on to describe the success of this program on the ice. The teams play older men including college division one hockey teams. In fact the 18 year old group beat the UM Hockey team in January 2013. In February 2013 they played in the 18 & under world championships in Sochi, Russia, the site of the 2014 Winter Olympics. Having medalled in this event the last ten years the pressure was on. Games were played in front of 10,000 people and were televised in Russia. The team defeated the Russian youth in front of Russian President Putin then made it to the finals where they lost to Canada in a close game achieving a silver medal. All of these young men come to Ann Arbor with college scholarships in hand. This year they think that about six will be drafted to the NHL probably including a number one draft pick. Detroit Red Wings goalie, Jimmy Howard, is a graduate of this program. More information, including the game schedule, is available on www.usantdp.com web site.
