Today's Program.....

John Bassett introduced our speaker, Richard Carlisle, Founder and Advisory Board member of Intentional Communities of Washtenaw. Their mission is to promote stable housing options and quality support services for adults with developmental disabilities, designed to reduce isolation and develop skills to live interdependently in a community setting. Dick told us about his daughter Megan who is developmentally disabled. Dick and his wife were concerned about their daughter's welfare when they are no longer around as care givers. When they looked around in 2004 they identified a need for a community of families to supply foundational support, resources and commitment that offers long term security to adults with developmental




disabilities and their families. The group also provides independent living housing for 7-9 adults in three community settings with a fourth about ready to start. There is a waiting list for housing and about 60 others in the non-residential program. Residents are supported by a Community Builder (staff person) on site. Also, Daily Living Coaches support individuals with disabilities to create and implement a plan to improve skill levels. A bonus emerged when participants provide coaching for others in their community. Stakeholders can donate, volunteer, and join the community. hhtp://www.intentcom.org
