Today's Program.....


The program was introduced by Claire Dahl. The speakers were Ian Sullivan and Ian Pudley from the University of Michigan Solar Car Team. The two team leaders gave an interesting presentation on the history and current events for the UM Solar Car Team. This is the largest non-athletic student organization on campus (150 members and 1200



alumni) and has an annual budget of approximately 2 million dollars. They build a new solar car every year and compete in both a national and international competition. They have won 7 of 11 national titles and have 5 third-place international finishes against "professional" teams. The team has two primary divisions, the Business Division headed by lan Sullivan, and the Engineering Division, headed by lan Pudley. The club is open to all interested students, but only dedicated workers are advanced to leadership positions. The students do not receive any pay, but some of the students can get academic credit. Participation on the team brings the students in contact with engineering and business leaders from around the world. The Solar Car is currently in Australia as the team prepares for the International Championship race in October. You can follow the team on U-Tube and on Facebook where the University of Michigan Solar Car Team is hoping to get 5,000 "likes" before the start of the International Championship.


