The history of Wystan Stevens, Ann Arbor Historian extraordinaire, is as interesting as his talks. An Ann Arbor native and U-M graduate, he is the namesake of a family friend, noted poet Wystan S. Auden, who taught briefly on campus in the mid-20th-century. On Monday, he provided an informative and entertaining run down of the foibles of a handful of U-M prexies. James Angell (for whom Angell Hall is named) insisted on a

flush toilet inside the president's home before he would consider the appointment. Satisfied, he served as U-M president almost 40 years until he was 82-years-old. And the board of regents did not wish for him to retire! Six U-M presidents are sculpted into gargoyles at archways in the Law Quad. Each piece of art represents the president's legacy. Thank you, Wystan, for a walk down memory lane that few of us have traveled. (The program is video-taped for future airing on the Community Television Network (CTN). 


