
Why Did Our Forefathers Condone Slavery?

**Dale Leslie** introduced Wally Schmeichel who has spoken to us several times, and is an Emeritus Professor of Religious Studies of Kalamazoo College. His topic was a historical look at the subject of slavery. The word slave comes from the Viking captives of Slavic countries. Professor Schmeichel said that slavery dates from ancient civilizations including the Greek and Roman empires, and slaves were then considered to be property. Our county's founders thought Europeans were superior and

five of the first seven presidents were slave owners. Slavery is now outlawed in most of the world. Professor Schmeichel said that our county fought a war to rid the county of slavery, that we recognized slavery as wrong and fixed it ourselves.


