Some History of the Park System in the Ann Arbor Area:



Members with a discerning eye may realize this photo of Al Gallup was not taken at this week's meeting. We missed that opportunity, but fortunately had this file photo of Al to remind everyone of his rugged good looks. ~Pub.

**Dick Benedek** introduced today's speaker, our own **Al Gallup**, a long time member of Kiwanis and former principal of Ann Arbor Community High School. Much of the history of the Ann Arbor Park system began in the early 1900s and centers around Al's father Eli Gallup, after whom Gallup Park was named. Eli had a degree in forestry and was certified to work in the forest service. He worked and lived in the Delhi Mills area, which, was completely destroyed by a tornado in 1917.

Eli was the first superintendent of parks and had an uncanny ability to organize. He had a unique knowledge of real estate that allowed him to stay ahead of the "developers" and to be able to arrange great deals involving trading and swaps leading to the creation of beautiful areas that pleased many people. In the process a large "rock" that had been pushed around the area by glaciers for thousands of years was relocated to a special spot on Washtenaw. Interestingly, many of today's parks used to be dumps corresponding vacant land at the time.

Today Ann Arbor has numerous parks, which total about 18 acres of parkland for every 1,000 residents; indeed there is a park located within a quarter of a mile from every resident living in the city. In addition there are a number of related recreational programs. We all owe a great debt of gratitude for the contributions and legacy of Eli Gallup, who played a huge role in developing Ann Arbor into the beautiful city it is today. We also thank son Al for enlightening us on this important local history, as well as for all the philanthropic things he does for the community and being a cherished member of our club.

### **New Kiwanis Project:**

Marianne D'Angelo has come up with a new project for Kiwanis called Flippin' for Kiwanis...

Flippin' for Kiwanis is a fun and creative event inspired by the TV show "Flea Market Flip." This monthlong initiative gives customers, members, and volunteers an opportunity to up-cycle a piece of furniture and sell it for more than it was originally priced. With a little bit of time, supplies, and imagination, pre-selected furniture pieces can be up-cycled for a profitable resale at the Kiwanis Center West (KCW) Thrift Sale.

KCW receives many wonderful donated pieces of furniture. Some, however, are old and tired. With a little bit of tender loving creativity, these pieces can be restored or transformed completely. Some of the pieces for the August event date back to the 30s and 40s and with some stripping, sanding and restaining can be restored to their original luster. Others might just need a coat of fresh paint. Each piece has a story to tell and its beauty will be in the eye of the beholder who agrees to bring it back to life.

Registration begins at KCW on Friday, July 15 at 9 AM, requires a \$10 (individual) or \$15 (dynamic duo) donation, and is limited to ten lucky participants identified by a first-come, first-served process. Registrants will choose their furniture piece at the time they register at KCW where the finding, fixing, and flipping will occur throughout the month of August. This event is a pilot project; we are open to making changes as we learn along the way. And do not despair! If you wanted to participate but were not one of the first ten, we hope to hold the event again and you will have another opportunity!

Finally, we have many generous supporters contributing materials, prize money (credit for the thrift sale), chalk paint technique demonstration, and anticipate more!

- August 19-20 & 26-27 the sale begins! These transformed and one-of-a-kind pieces will be displayed and offered for sale in an up-cycled area at the KCW store during regular store hours. Prices will be determined by the *crafters who need not be present for the sale*.
