Local Strategies in Addressing Terrorism:



Sergeant Thomas Hickey

Sergeant Thomas Hickey of the Ann Arbor Police Department spoke to us on what to do if a terrorist comes to your meeting. He spoke briefly about the lockdown last Friday at Huron High School when a man dressed in dark clothes and a mask entered the school. Police responded and searched the school but they did not arrest anyone. It may have been a prank but they did not treat it as being a prank.

He told us of the acronym 'ALICE'

A: Alert. Police have to be alerted when something does not look right. He advised us that 'if we see something - say something.'

L: Lockdown. When a terrorist strikes, the building goes into a lockdown situation.

I: Inform. Maintain constant communications with Police. Be aware of exits, fire emergency, and what to do if you have to leave in a hurry.

C: Counter. The shooter is trying to kill you. Distract him. You have to do whatever it takes to distract the shooter. Throw things at him and get others to do the same. This will upset his plans and give the Police time to intervene.

E: Evacuate. Get out of there.

If something bad happens think about how to survive. You can't save anyone if you are not around. Save yourself first and call the Police. For more on ALICE, go to this [link](#).

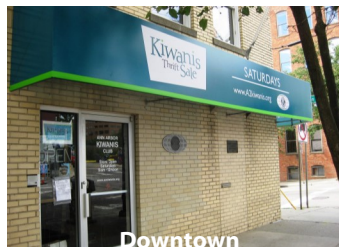
