Today's Program...

Solar Power in AA: An Idea Whose Time Has Come:

Dennis Powers introduced Mark Clevey, Vice Chair of the AA Energy Commission and Chair of the Solar Energy Subcommittee.

The Commission started in 1981. The AA Council enacted the Ann Arbor Climate Plan in 2012 which set greenhouse gas emission goals. Renewable energy was set to achieve 20% of the goal with energy efficiency making up the other 80%. Mark was not here to present a program on the role of greenhouse gas in climate change which he believes is a fact. Rather he reported on the present and future

use of solar energy in achieving greenhouse gas emission goals.

Michigan is a world leader in producing solar energy hardware. Ann Arbor has the capacity to reach the renewable energy goal using roof top solar cells. Mark stated that solar cells can be cost effective but solar cell installers say that the zoning, permit and property tax treatment of such installations make the job harder to justify. Mark noted that a solar cell installation on the roof of a residence costs about \$9,200. Ann Arbor has issued 111 solar cell installation permits.

Mark advocates for a public/private partnership to reach the solar cell installation goal in ten years. The City Council agreed and passed a solar cell installation goal resolution in June, 2016. Options include solar cell installations on residence roofs, installations on larger public and private buildings, and large ground arrays. Other renewable energy options include more nuclear power (i.e. Fermi units 2 & 3), and wind turbines off shore in Lake Michigan. Ann Arbor's McNaughton/McKay is the largest solar installer in Michigan.
