Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Keynote Address



Arlene Barnes introduced our Martin Luther King, Jr. Day speaker, Danya Bacchus. Danya is a distinguished Knight-Wallace Fellow at the U of M, is a journalist and reporter for NBC in San Diego, and she is president of the San Diego Association of Black Journalists.

Danya spoke about the legacy of Martin Luther King, Jr. and her life growing up in Memphis and, later, in Virginia. She focused her remarks on the

rise of "leaderless" movements springing up on social media such as Facebook, Twitter, and Snapchat. Danya discussed "digital activism" noting that it creates opportunities for spontaneous assemblies in real time, and as an example talked about the "Black Lives Matter" movement that was sparked by a hashtag circulated online by activist, Alicia Garza.
