#### Today's Program...

Trials and Tribulations: We're a New City

Max Ziegler introduced today's speaker: Shawn Keough, City of Dexter Mayor. Shawn and his family moved to Dexter in 2001. Dexter was originally a village, in November 2014, the residents voted to adopt a city charter, making it into a new city. Between 2000 and 2010, Dexter's population grew 74%, to 4,067, making it one of the fastest growing communities in the state. The Dexter area was first settled in 1824, 13 years before Michigan became a state. It was first known as "Mill Creek Settlement" until the village was platted in 1830, when it was named the Village of Dexter.

The founder of the village, Samuel W. Dexter served as the chief justice of the Washtenaw County Court and a University of Michigan regent. His home, Gordon

Hall, just southwest of the city was built in the early 1840s and is a landmark in the area. Samuel Dexter was a staunch abolitionist, and it is nearly certain that Gordon Hall was a stop on the Underground Railroad. In 1950 Gordon Hall was gifted to the University of Michigan. In 2006, the Dexter Area Historical Society and Museum purchased Gordon Hall.

The new City of Dexter hires a City Manager for the day to day running of the city. Members of council are elected as non-partisan. The journey to become a city started as a review of services received from the two townships from which the new city was formed. It was determined that costs being paid by the village to those two townships could be better realized by becoming a city.

The new City of Dexter has a DDA, connection to the Metro Park system and the Border to Border trail, an Arts and Cultural Council, good schools, and the new Mill Creek Park. Mill Creek and the Huron River form much of the western and northeastern boundaries of the city and have long been valuable resources to Dexter. The City is the home of the Encore Music Theater, a farmers market, cider mill, and numerous festivals and restaurants. In the future, it is exploring greater sharing of regional services such as public safety and public transportation.




