

Today's Program...

Advances in Cancer Care

Deb Jones preceded her introduction of today's speaker with the story of her personal experience with cancer. She talked about her diagnosis, which thrust her into a world of new information and experiences. Deb related that she received excellent compassionate care at the St. Joseph Mercy Ann Arbor Cancer Center. Now a cancer survivor, she has new understanding for those engaged in this battle and a new appreciation for the gifts of life and health. Deb then introduced Dr. Phil Stella, who is the Medical Director of the Oncology Program at St. Joseph Mercy Hospital Ann Arbor and the Director of the Cancer Care Center.

million fund raised by grants and the community. Dr. Stella's efforts include clinical research, which allows patients access to experimental drugs and treatments; the implementation of new technologies, such as Cyber Knife, which is highly focused radiation; and immunology, which uses "designer" drugs to attack cancer cells specific to each person, based upon the cancer's genome. Dr. Stella pointed out that cancer care is more than technology; it includes the delivery of care: having patient navigators for each patient, who provide education and arrange needed tests and appointments in a multi-discipline environment. On a larger scale, the Center strives to reduce cancer occurrences with more regular screening and education about cancer prevention with healthy life choices, such as stop-smoking campaigns. While a diagnosis of "cancer" will always be an anxiety-provoking event, it is reassuring to know that excellent care is at hand and that personal support will assure us we are not alone.



Foundation and Club Budgets:





Copies of both budgets were available on the tables. **Cliff Sheldon** reviewed the Foundation budget and pointed out that the unexpected early move out of Sheridan Books from KCW had caused a \$100,000 shortfall in income for this administrative year. Subsequent adjustments to the Foundation Budget were made, including the reduction of grant money available. Details of Grant Policy decisions and opportunities to help were presented by **Mike Dabbs** last week and reported in the newsletter. **Dan Dever** announced that a short-term lease to a storage company had just been signed, with a \$5000 deposit paid toward the lease total of \$18,000. Additional rentals of space and sale of the lot on the corner will "right the ship". **Larry French** reviewed the Club budget and pointed out that there is a reserve fund of approximately \$40,000, which has been drawn upon in the past to cover some administrative costs. This year, there will be a \$1,545 surplus. Talk to Cliff or Larry if you have questions or concerns.
