## Today's Program...

#### What We Know About Leadership:

**Al Engerer** introduced today's speaker, Larry L. Fobes whose background includes an executive MBA from Duke University, the Executive Program at the U of M Ross School of Business, and an engineering graduate degree at U of M. His corporate experience includes 30 years with Ford Motor Company in product design, scientific research, operational finance, and global business strategy. He is the founder of Learning from Leaders, LLC, as well as cofounder of Learning with Leaders, LLC.

Larry created, hosts, and co-produces with Detroit Public Television, the Emmy award winning TV series "Leaders on Leadership". The series includes numerous interviews with well over 125 well known leaders—including presidents, CEOs and Directors of major businesses and organizations. (An impressive list of individuals interviewed was provided as a handout.) All of these

individuals were queried on what they believed are key factors necessary in the growth and development of successful organizations. Many of these interviews are available as videos on YouTube. It was noted that leadership generally relates to six domains concerning whether an individual is: responsible, inspirational, supportive, personal, relational, and contextual. Successful leaders: 1) have their own style; 2) learn from other leaders; 3) are creative; 4) can translate diverse input into a cohesive theme; 5) have focus and persistence; 6) concentrate on the big issues; 7) must be willing to take risks; 8) must be authentic; 9) must have superb people around them; and 10) make sure each person in the group is thriving. (One story was about General John

Jumper, who had to deal with the 911 attacks during his first day on the job as Chief of Staff of the Air Force.) It was pointed out that historically one of the worst examples of decision making related to the failure of Eastman Kodak to take advantage of their own discovery of the digital camera. Their "leadership" decided that Kodak's business should focus on the "chemical" processing of film. Overall this was a very interesting and informative presentation.

#### Flippin' for Kiwanis:

**Marianne D'Angelo** has come up with a new project for Kiwanis called *Flippin'* for Kiwanis. *Flippin'* for Kiwanis is a fun and creative event inspired by the TV show "Flea Market Flip." This month-long initiative gives customers, members, and volunteers an opportunity to up-cycle a piece of furniture and sell it for more than it was originally priced. With a little bit of time, supplies, and imagination, pre-selected furniture pieces can be up-cycled for a profitable resale at the Kiwanis Center West (KCW) Thrift Sale.

KCW receives many wonderful donated pieces of furniture. Some, however, are old and tired. With a little bit of tender loving creativity, these pieces can be restored or transformed completely. Some of the pieces for the August event date back to the 30s and 40s and with some stripping, sanding and re-staining can be restored to their original luster. Others might just need a coat of fresh paint. Each piece has a story to tell and its beauty will be in the eye of the beholder who agrees to bring it back to life.

Registration begins at KCW on Friday, July 15 at 9 AM, requires a \$10 (individual) or \$15 (dynamic duo) donation, and is limited to ten lucky participants identified by a first-come, first-served process. August 5, 6, 12, and 13 are days KCW will offer the space to re-vitalize these one-of-a-kind pieces. The public is welcome to come and peer in to get a sneak peek while the work is being done.

The sale begins Friday, August 19 and will run through August 27 during regular KCW thrift sale hours. Prices will be determined by crafters and whoever earns the largest percentage profit margin increase will be identified as first place winner!

This event is a pilot project; we are open to making changes as we learn along the way. And do not despair! If you wanted to participate but were not one of the first ten, we hope to hold the event again and you will have another opportunity!

Finally, we have many generous supporters contributing materials, prize money (credit for the thrift sale), chalk paint technique demonstration, and anticipate more!
