Steve McCarty

In the second half of todays presentations Steve McCarty said that he is honored to be serving as the 2015-2016 Governor of Michigan District of Circle K International. He is currently heading into his second year at the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, where he is studying Communications and Political Science. He has been a member of the Kiwanis Family for three years and service fellowship and leadership are all things he is passionate about. He said that Circle K has influenced his life in many ways and that it has offered countless opportunities to enhance his leadership and to gain so many new friends. He says that Circle K is the best organization because its members are continually growing. He said his club raised more money per member than any other Circle K Club for the ELIMINATE project. He added that their main priority for Circle K is Service.

Steve asked what else we can do to invite Circle K members to participate in our organization. Can we go to their meetings and offer our expertise? How about mentoring and job shadowing to increase engagement? Can we reduce the cost for new members transitioning from Circle K to our club? He discussed the importance of using social media in attract-

ing members and accomplishing community service projects—especially for those in the Circle K age range.

He described how the goals for the Michigan District Circle K are ambitious, yet attainable. To meet these goals they will

need every branch of Kiwanis on board. they are looking to grow 100 to 550 members as a district and to complete 17,500 service hours. On top of that, they are looking to charter four new Circle K Chapters. In their final year of the ELIMINATE project the goal was \$5,000—their highest ever. Christian Wire, a UM Chemical Engineering Sophomore from Battle Creek, is the Kiwanis Family Relations Chair for UM Circle K. This committee develops social, service, and networking events with other Circle K and Kiwanis Family clubs in order to build strong relationships with them. They set up interclubs, service projects, socials, and larger events with Key Clubs (high school level), Circle K clubs (college level), and Kiwanis Clubs (adult level) in the area, as well as inform other clubs about the activities of Circle K at U of M and invite them to join.
