TODAY'S PROGRAM...

Martin Luther King, Jr. Day



Rev. Mashod A. Evans, Sr.

Pres William introduced our distinguished speaker, Rev. Mashod A. Evans, Sr., Pastor of Bethel African Methodist Episcopal Church in Ann Arbor, describing Rev. Evans as a pastor who delivers sermons everyone remembers. Kiwanians present for today's program will definitely remember Rev. Evans' description of his early days in the ministry when he pastored an inner-city church in Birmingham, Alabama located close to key sites of the Civil Rights Movement, including the Birmingham City Jail and the 16th Street Baptist Church, where four young girls died in a 1963 church bombing. Almost every day someone would knock on the door of Rev. Evans' church for assistance or maybe just to talk.

Rev. Evans gave an example of one who might stop to talk by describing a man who, during his youth, shared a bed with his brother in his uncle's bedroom. His father wasn't around much. The man was afflicted with ADD and was always a problem. Later in his life, he had four children, but, like his father before him, the man was often absent from his home. The man had a criminal record with thirty arrests and seemed to always be in the middle

of something where he wasn't invited to be. Rev. Evans said that he wondered how he could have helped the man but that the man was killed, dying a violent death. There were gasps in the room when Rev. Evans informed us that the man he described was, in fact, Martin Luther King, Jr., who in 1964 was considered a rabble rouser and an outside troublemaker in Birmingham. By his story, Rev. Evans encourages us to action and to become involved, like Dr. King, despite obstacles others might place in our way. Each of us lives a life of opportunity and privilege, Rev. Evans said, but privilege is both a blessing and a burden, a burden to serve and to share rather than just to hold tight to what we have.

Poet Robert Frost is a favorite of Rev. Evans, who talked of Frost's "Mending Wall." In this poem from early in his career, Frost poses the thought that "Good fences make good neighbours" but continues with the question "Why do they make good neighbours?" Rev. Evans said that Dr. King would agree, as Dr. King associated fences or walls with separation and anxiety when viewing the Berlin Wall in 1964. Rev. Evans continued with Frost's "Stopping by the Woods on a Snowy Evening," which concludes by saying "The woods are lovely, dark and deep, But I have promises to keep, And miles to go before I sleep, And miles to go before I sleep." There is much work for us to do, as we strive to advance the legacy and vision of Dr. King, before we can sleep.

Rev. Evans' remarks sparked a number of questions and comments. **Garry Evans** observed that Dr. King founded his efforts based on his faith, and he asked if the movement has reached its apex or might be tapering off. Rev. Evans responded with his conviction that the movement is not tapering off but in fact has grown to other social or political movements that are based on nonviolence and the core beliefs of what is right and just, citing the "Me Too Movement" as an example.

Claire Dahl agreed with Rev. Evans remarks about privilege. Claire recommends the book *Ruth and the Green Book*, by author Calvin Alexander Ramsey. When Ruth and her parents take a motor trip in the 1950s from Chicago to Alabama to visit her grandma, they are forced to rely on THE NEGRO MOTORIST GREEN BOOK to find places that will serve them. A good read with children or grandchildren, Claire said. **Sally and Burt Lamkin** reported that Burt attended the Boston University School of Theology in 1954-55 when Dr. King was in his last year of doctoral studies in the same school.

- On behalf of the Budget & Finance Committee, **Larry French** provided Foundation financial highlights, including selected first quarter financial results:
 - ❖ Lease revenue for the quarter of \$28,070;
 - ❖ Have been fully leased for at least 18 months;
 - ❖ Unrestricted donations of \$6,250;
 - ❖ Sales revenue of \$91,944 for December and of \$245,307 for the first quarter;
 - ❖ Net income for the quarter of \$135,814;
 - ❖ Payments to Kiwanis related entities (mainly the Michigan District Foundation) of \$11,972;
 - ❖ Unrestricted cash available of \$429,090;
 - ❖ Projected capital expenditures for the fiscal year of \$225,000;
 - ❖ Projected capital expenditures for future years include roof expenses of \$250,000 and other expenses of \$142,000 (the roof could be more; Building & Equipment Committee will be requesting bids);
 - ❖ \$400,000 was transferred from the Reserve Account to assist with the purchase of the Kiwanis Center; \$130,000 has been returned to the Reserve Account with a determination yet to be made on the remaining \$270,000.
