TODAY'S PROGRAM... UM BUILDING UPDATE

Bob Gray introduced today's speaker, Susan Gott, the University Planner for the University of Michigan-Ann Arbor. She is a life-long Ann Arbor resident and has served as the Universi-

ty Planner since 2002. She oversees planning projects for all types of campus buildings and related infrastructure including roads, utilities, and open spaces. The University's planning process reflects four major themes—enhancing campus life; emphasizing stewardship and sustainability; honoring tradition while remaining flexible; and strengthening connectivity on campus and with the outside world.



University Planning manages a daunting array of projects and Susan described many of the larger ones in progress. Some highlights:

- Central Campus Classroom Building and the Alexander G. Ruthven Building Renovation—demolition of the 1960 addition to the Ruthven Building and construction of a new 100,000 square foot building. Renovation and reuse of the Albert Kahn designed Ruthven Building. Estimated completion fall 2021.
- Dental W.K. Kellogg Institute Building Expansion and Renovation—renovation of 176,000 square feet and addition

of 48,000 square feet. Estimated completion spring 2022.

- MMED Clinical Inpatient Tower—new 690,000 square foot inpatient tower with 264 single -occupancy patient rooms. Estimated completion spring 2024.
- New Central Campus Recreation Building Replacement new 200,000 square foot recreation building. Estimated completion TBD.
- Michigan Union Renovation—deep renovation of the 250,000 square foot building. Estimated completion winter 2020. Stay tuned for community open house tours planned for mid-January.
- Wall Street West Parking Structure—1,080-space parking structure to relieve parking shortages on the Medical and Central Campuses. Estimated completion fall 2020.


HOSPITALITY...


