TODAY'S PROGRAM...



Deb Jones introduced today's speaker, Mark Munzenberger. He serves as the Financial Education Specialist at both the University of Michigan and at Eastern Michigan University Credit Unions. He facilitates a number of financial workshops for people of all ages, especially credit education, first time home buyership, and identity theft prevention. Mark holds a certification from the National Financial Educators Counsel and received an award from the Credit Union National Association in 2018 that is given annually to select Credit Unions for excellence in provid-

ing consumer financial education to Credit Union members and to the community.

Mark said that he was honored to be here and appreciated the invitation. He is usually asked to speak at college campuses, to students, or to retirees. He surprised us a bit by saying that instead of doing a regular PowerPoint Presentation, he would present his information through a question and answer format where we in the audience were challenged to answer financial questions.

We formed teams of three and kept track of our answers in the 20-question 'Financial Quiz Bowl'. The team with the most correct answers would win a prize bag. He wished us luck and with that he put the first question up on the screen. It was, 'What is the largest bank in the United States by assets?" Many bank names were tossed around but the answer to this question was

JP Morgan Chase. The next question was, "Invented in 1896, the Dow Jones Industrial Average is a price-weighted average of the stock price of how many companies traded on the New York Stock Exchange (NYSE) and the Nasdaq?" And the answer was 30. There were questions on credit scores, bankruptcy filings, cyber-crime, and when beneficiaries were able to sign up for Medicare.

In total 20 interesting questions were asked that we all knew something about but not necessarily the right answer. This turned out to be a very engaging way of presenting financial information and kept all of our attention. In the end, three teams each got 15 out of 20 correct answers and Mark had a prize bag for each. HOSPITALITY...


President William gave the Hospitality Report. He was happy to say that **Bob Carr**, who had been recently hospitalized, was able to attend today' meeting.

3-MINUTE SPEECH...

Jim Dries gave his three minute speech. He brought his own hour glass type timer which was actually an approximately 90 second soft boiled egg timer that he said that he would have to turn over one time. Jim is one of the first of the baby boomer generation, which is the generation that all of the other generations are blaming all of today's problems on. He was born in Milwaukee, home of Harley-Davison and Blatz Beer. His family moved to the Detroit area when he was six years old. He graduated from high school in Birmingham and went into the military from 1966 to 1969—spending a year on the central coast of Vietnam helping to run a seaport. He came back and attended Michigan State University where he attained a degree in marketing, then went to the U of M and earned another degree. They asked if he wanted his ribs hot or extra hot and he knew that was a place where he wanted to be. Places where you have to be are when your eight year old grandchild is giving a clarinet recital or the courthouse. Places where you can do both of those things are few and far between and Kiwanis is one of them. He said that we ought to be here because of what we do for our community and we want to be here because of the fellowship that we experience with the other club members. With that, the last few grains of sand had drained from his timer.


