



TODAY'S PROGRAM...Gelman Dioxane Plume Update

Dale Leslie took the podium to introduce today's guest, Roger Rayle, who's been tirelessly fighting for our community's health and well being for the past 23 years. Dubbed the Gelman Plume Watchdog, Roger is the Chair of Scio Residents for Safe Water and co-founder and Chairman of the Coalition for Action on Remediation of Dioxane. He's also been quite a force of one in fighting the spread of the Gelman Dioxane Plume and making those responsible accountable. He's well known throughout Washtenaw County and beyond for his volunteer efforts to protect our most valuable resource, the water we depend on for life.

As Roger noted, Michigan's Great Lakes contain over one fifth of the world's fresh water supply. There is also a lot of water running beneath the state. It's that underground supply that's being threatened by the 1,4-dioxane contamination discovered at the Gelman Sciences property after Gelman Sciences disposed of hundreds of thousands of pounds of dioxane by spraying it into the air and dumping it into nearby waterways. Dioxane is an industrial solvent that was used to drill tiny holes in high tech filters and it was the leftover dioxane that was

disposed of, amassing groundwater. This went on for decades while citizens drank from contaminated wells and swam in contaminated waterways, many of our members included. This problem persists, with wells in the area still testing above acceptable levels. Compounding the issue is a disagreement over which test is used to detect the dioxane. The state of MI and Gelman itself use older tests that don't show smaller amounts of contamination, which is helpful in knowing where the Plume will move to next. The EPA has such a test available and uses it.

Members participated, sharing what information they have, while Roger showed us maps of the historical spread and height of dioxane located in a particular area at a particular time. This was helpful in understanding the nature of the Plume and its seemingly unnatural movement throughout the water table. Being such a stable element, it holds together and spreads sporadically with the rise and fall of the water table levels, meaning it travels in many different directions and we can only guess where it'll move to in the future. Earlier this year, a resolution was approved unanimously by Ann Arbor's City Council to ask the U.S. EPA to add the site to the Superfund program and meetings are on-going. Roger encouraged us to attend the next meeting of government authorities, Gelman representatives and citizens to be held on or around December 12, 2019 to request the EPA cleanup option, favored by citizens and our local government representatives. The Kiwanis Thrift Sale began 92 years ago, in 1927, as a once-a-year sale. It was located in downtown Ann Arbor through 2018 when all of its operations were moved to 100 N. Staebler Rd., a former book manufacturing facility. After extensive capital improvements, it now has over 30,000 square feet of sales space in addition to rented offices and warehouse space.

The Kiwanis Club of Ann Arbor, and its Foundation, have a long tradition of supporting children and families in need within our Community. In addition to monetary support, they also provide direct gifts of merchandise to identified families and many non-profit agencies. This combined support now totals over \$7,200,000 since 1927.

The higher thrift sales revenues will enable The Kiwanis Club of Ann Arbor and its Foundation to set increased goals for what will be given back to the Community. This is done through scholarships and grants to local agencies that provide support to children, individuals and families in need each year.

The Kiwanis Thrift Sale is located at 100 N. Staebler Rd. off of West Jackson, one mile west of Zeeb Rd. It is open to the public on Fridays and Saturdays throughout the year from 9:00 am to 1:00 pm. It is closed on major holidays.
