### TODAY'S PROGRAM... *Preemie Pals*

Larry French introduced Nancy Memmer, who is the spouse of Michigan District Governor Larry Memmer and who leads "Preemie Pals," a Kiwanis Young Children Priority One Project. Nancy, along with District Governor Larry, are members of the Saline Kiwanis Club. Winnie Brys, of the Tecumseh Kiwanis Club, Cyndi Etsler, and Audrey Schwimmer also have leadership roles in Preemie Pals and assisted Nancy in her inspirational and moving presentation of the project, which Nancy described as "The First Lady's Project."

Preemie Pals makes quilts for premature babies who are cared for at the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) of the C.S. Mott Children's Hospital. Mott Hospital serves as a regional facility for premature babies, many of whom are flown to Mott from throughout Michigan and neighboring states for acute care in the NICU. The premature infants may weigh two pounds or less and are so fragile that their immature skin cannot be touched. For these tiny babies, the quilts cover their isolettes, helping to control humidity, light, temperature and sound while surrounding the babies in comfort. The mother's breast milk is sometimes dabbed on a flannel quilt square, which then has a smell similar to the mother's amniotic fluid; the quilt square is placed within the isolette near the baby to provide a calming effect. As the preemies develop, they may be wrapped in the quilts, which eventually accompany the baby to his or her home when discharged from the hospital. Most quilts are returned to the NICU for reuse when the growing baby is finished with it.

Preemie Pals meets on the fourth Monday of each month at The Quilting Season quilt shop in Saline. Quilt materials are available in kits from Preemie Pals, which may be completed by Kiwanians or others and returned to Nancy. Quilters may also make 100% cotton quilts that are approximately 36 inches by 42 inches from their own quilting materials for use by the Preemie Pals project. Following the Preemie Pals program, **Bob Carr** moved that all Happy Dollars and Fines collected today be donated to the Preemie Pals project, and the motion passed unanimously.
