#### TODAY'S PROGRAM...

#### Brain Fitness at 50 and Beyond!



**Deb Jones** introduced today's speaker Barbara Bowman, MPA, NTP, who presented a spirited program on "Brain Fitness at 50 and Beyond". Barbara is a certified Nutritional Therapy Practitioner and Health Coach. More than her credentials, however, Barbara's informative and encour-

aging presentation about improving brain health urged us to pay attention to the things we can do to take care of our brains:

**Food**: Avoid sugar...no more than 5mg per serving... read the labels; eat fish... lots of it... take fish oil supplement; eat simple real foods, avoiding processed packaged foods

**Exercise**: Exercise both brain and body, like dancing! "The best exercise is the one you will DO!

<u>Stress Reduction</u>: Minimize worry... practice daily gratitude, naming at least five things each day for which you are grateful.

<u>Test and Track</u>: Tools are available to measure progress in improving brain health and cognitive functioning. Lumosity and other computer programs designed to support cognitive function also track your improvement in game scores.

Why should we change our habits? One in three of us will develop Alzheimer's; by age 85 half will have symptoms of the disease; the cost for one year of full time memory care is \$60,000 plus untold grief and stress on caregivers and loved ones. Hopefully, these sobering statistics will motivate us all to take action.

Individual contributions will be matched through collaboration between the Ray and Eleanor Cross Foundation, the Smith/Gray Scholarship Endowment Fund and Burg/ Hillenburg funds. Kiwanis members and friends can contribute any amount toward the scholarship total. The goal for individual gifts is \$23,000. All gifts need to be made by April 30, 2019. ## Kiwanis 2019 Finish Line Scholarship Program

#### How the Program Works

Kiwanis will support two categories of "full ride" scholarships at Washtenaw Community College in 2019 - 2020:

- <u>Category One</u> will consist of 8 scholarships for first year WCC students who are residents of the Ann Arbor School District and 2019 graduates of the Ann Arbor Public Schools with financial needs.
- <u>Category Two</u> will consist of 10 students, also AAPS graduates, who have successfully completed their first year at WCC, but will most likely be unable to complete their studies without additional financial support. (Please note that this reflects an aspirational goal, and the number (10) will be adjusted – up or down - as our fundraising total dictates.)

Each \$3,500 scholarship in both categories will cover tuition, books, and fees for the entire year. Students will need to successfully complete their first semester studies in order to receive second semester funding. Kiwanis will also contribute \$2,000 to an emergency fund, which these 18 students can draw upon if necessary to meet unexpected hardship expenses.

#### **Fund Raising Plan**

The Kiwanis Club of Ann Arbor Foundation Board of Directors and the Children and Youth Services Committee have together budgeted \$18,000 for academic scholarships this year. In addition, all donations from Club members will be matched through collaboration between the Ray and Eleanor Cross Foundation, the Smith/Gray Scholarship Endowment Fund and Burg/Hillenburg funds.
