GUESTS AT OUR CLUB...

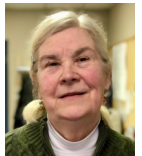

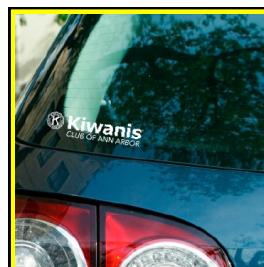
