TODAY'S PROGRAM... Treeline Conservancy

Past President Ann Mattson had the pleasure of introducing not just one, but three Guest Speakers today, representing the Treeline Conservancy and its efforts to complete the Allen Creek Urban Trail.

Heather Seyfarth, Community Engagement Specialist for the City of Ann Arbor and Project Manager of the Treeline Project, has over 10 years of experience completing community planning projects. Among her many degrees, she holds a Masters in Social Work and Urban Planning from UM and was named one of Traverse City's 40 under 40 in the Traverse City Business News.

Joe O'Neal, owner of O'Neal Construction, Inc. (founded in 1961), has overseen the building or renovation of hundreds of local projects, includ-

ing The Power Center, The Michigan Theater building, Zaragon Place and the Hands on Museum. Long active in conservation work, he was the founding Board President of the Allen Creek Greenway. He holds a law degree from the UM Law School and a Masters in Engineering from a Heather Seyfarth school down south that starts with "The".

Norman Herbert, Co-chair of the Conservancy Board, was a member of UM's financial management team for 35 years. He's served on many local bank and community foundation boards, is a Past President of the Ann Arbor Rotary Club, and is currently a Director and Treasurer of the

Washtenaw Housing Alliance and co-chair of the Washtenaw Healthcare Initiative. He holds a degree from Earlham College and lives with his family in Ann Arbor.

Together, Heather, Joe and Norman told us the history of Allen Creek and the eventual creation of the Treeline Conservancy, a non-profit Joe O'Neal working with the City of Ann Arbor and Washtenaw County Parks and Rec, to fund and build a non-motorized greenway running from Argo Dam to downtown Ann Arbor. Further expansion of the planned 2 miles is a future goal but, at this time, getting the first 2000 feet out from Argo Dam is the main focus. With MDOT Railroad Tracks and busy Main Street in the path, this will be the most difficult part of the project. Due to all the variables, the costs for this project are not yet available but, the Treeline hopes to break ground in 2020 with the help of both public and private funds.

The benefits of having the Treeline in our community are many. In addition to providing a safe path for those walking and biking through the city, it promotes these healthy alternatives and provides a more peaceful and calming environment right here in the heart of the city. We're blessed to live in a place with so much natural beauty all around us and Norman Herbert this trail will provide more access to more people. The Treeline can also be a boost to our local economy as a draw for the many tourists visiting the area.



The Kiwanis Club of Ann Arbor Foundation Inc. announced that for the first time its Kiwanis Thrift Sale annual gross revenue exceeded \$1 Million for the fiscal year which ended September 30, 2019. The Kiwanis Thrift Sale began 92 years ago, in 1927, as a once-a-year sale. It was located in downtown Ann Arbor through 2018 when all of its operations were moved to 100 N. Staebler Rd., a former book manufacturing facility. After extensive capital improvements, it now has over 30,000 square feet of sales space in addition to rented offices and warehouse space.

The Kiwanis Club of Ann Arbor, and its Foundation, have a long tradition of supporting children and families in need within our Community. In addition to monetary support, they also provide direct gifts of merchandise to identified families and many non-profit agencies. This combined support now totals over \$7,200,000 since 1927.

The higher thrift sales revenues will enable The Kiwanis Club of Ann Arbor and its Foundation to set increased goals for what will be given back to the Community. This is done through scholarships and grants to local agencies that provide support to children, individuals and families in need each year.

The Kiwanis Thrift Sale is located at 100 N. Staebler Rd. off of West Jackson, one mile west of Zeeb Rd. It is open to the public on Fridays and Saturdays throughout the year from 9:00 am to 1:00 pm. It is closed on major holidays.

The Kiwanis Thrift Sale's continued growth over the last 92 years, culminating in its \$1 Million year, could not have happened without the ongoing support of Kiwanis Thrift Sale Volunteers, Kiwanis Club Members, Staff, and of course, the many Kiwanis Thrift Sale Shoppers and those who donate merchandise.
