#### TODAY'S PROGRAM...

Great Lakes Rising

Kathie Wilder introduced our speaker Andrew Gronewold, Associate Professor in the School of Environment and Sustainability at the University of Michigan. Drew, as he prefers to be called, spoke today about Great Lakes Rising Water Levels: relationships to climate change.

Drew described the Great Lakes system, including the watershed surrounding each lake, as the largest fresh water lake system on earth. This year the levels of the Great Lakes are reaching record heights. The previous high water record was set in 1986; the record low level was reached in 2013. Extensive data points on graphs show annual fluctuation, with high water in spring and lower water in fall. Over time, however, one can see that levels are changing.

What makes the water levels go up and down? The hydrologic cycle is influenced by precipitation, evaporation, and runoff. Changes in climate affect these elements in interesting ways: as the lakes' water temperature rises, more water evaporates, which cause more lake effect snow. We saw a dramatic photo of a snowstorm forming over Lake Ontario.

Drew also described the Great Lakes as a mighty river system with water flowing from one lake to the next. The water flow rate increases on its way until it reaches the Gulf of St. Lawrence with a flow rate equal to that of the Mississippi River.

Continued research and data collection on the Great Lakes can help formulate water resource management policies in the future.
