TODAY'S PROGRAM...The Finish Line Scholarship Program



Dan Burroughs and Peter Schork led our annual Kiwanis Scholarship award day. The scholarship program has been completely revamped to give one year, full ride scholarships to Washtenaw Community College students. The club awarded a \$72,000 check to the WCC Foundation, which will distribute the scholarship funds to their students. The photos on pages 4 and 5 show the awardees who were present and the named scholarship presenters. At this point, fifteen WCC students have been matched with named scholarships with five additional recipients to be announced

at a later date. You'll find the full list of awardees on page 3.

Dr. Rose Bellanca, WCC President, noted that the average age of their students is 27 and that 50% of their students already have a bachelors degree. She asked the audience to fill in the answer to the question "What do you call a WCC student?" We answered "Employed." Phil Snyder from the WCC Foundation thanked our club's scholarship committee for their

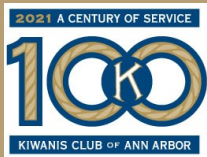

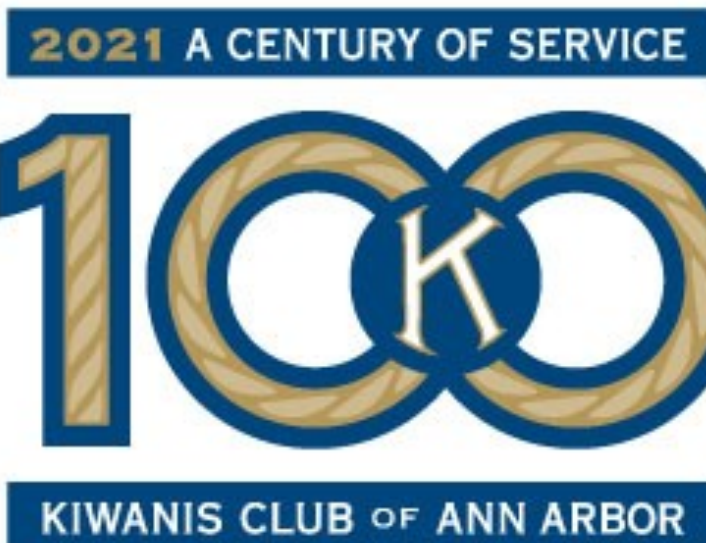
