Jim Carey introduced Jim Brandstatter who spoke on UM Football. Jim has a 47 year broadcasting career. He was pleased that President William remembered his birthday from his last visit to our club. Jim has a podcast called "The Brandy Show - Jim Brand-statter" in the spirit of JP McCarthy's "focus" in which he has conversations with area luminaries.

Jim noted that the UM vs Middle Tennessee State game was not perfect but it was a win. The offense

yards gained exceeded last year's average. He believes that next week's game will be competitive because of Army's triple option offense. As to Michigan's quarterback Jim favors Shea Patterson because of his poise Today's guest, Jim Brandstatter in the passing game.


