TODAY'S PROGRAM...*Children's Literacy Network*

Evan LeRoy, with the aid of daughter Lucy, introduced today's speakers, Betsy Durant and Cindy Saper of Children's Literacy Network. Books are not always easily accessible to low-income families. Children's Literacy Network (CLN) is a volunteer-based nonprofit in Washtenaw County dedicated to closing the book and reading achievement gap for low-income students. The organization was founded in 1991 by a group of educators who were some of the first Head Start teachers in Detroit. CLN's original mission is still in place today.

CLN operates four proven programs:

- **Mothers & Babies**—focused on increasing maternal bonding and model reading interactions.
- **Read to Kids**—aimed at the county's most vulnerable children; parents earn free books by reading aloud with their children.
- **Staying in Closer Touch**—volunteers record parents in correctional facilities reading aloud for their children.

CLNReads—summer book program.

And two new programs:

- **FLIP**—Family Literacy Interactive Program events are curriculum-based fun nights that take place at local elementary schools and Head Start preschools.

BookPALS—think pen pals but with books and interaction among second-graders at Ypsilanti, Saline, and Dexter elementary schools.

CLN does all its work with volunteers and only two part-time staff members. They can always use additional volunteers and opportunities are available in the Ambassador Program, the various operating programs, technical support, graphics and design, and on book drives. 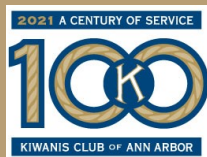

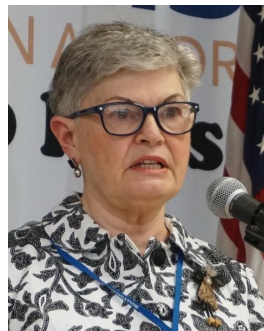

Margaret Krasnoff had a happy \$5 for Circle K and their work on KEEP maintenance.

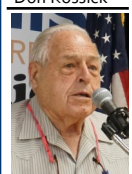

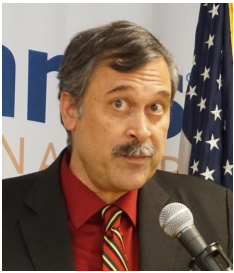

Kiwanis Scholarship Program 2019

How the Program Works:

Kiwanis will support two categories of "full ride" scholarships at Washtenaw Community College in 2019 - 20. Category One will consist of eight scholarships for first year students who are Ann Arbor residents and 2019 graduates of the Ann Arbor Public Schools with financial needs. Category Two will consist of 10 students, also AAPS graduates, who have successfully completed their first year at WCC, but who would probably be unable to continue their studies without additional financial support. Each scholarship in both categories will be for \$3500, which will cover tuition, books, and fees for the entire year. Students will need to successfully complete their first semester studies in order to be eligible for second semester funding. Kiwanis will also contribute \$2000 to an emergency fund which students with unexpected hardship expenses can draw upon when necessary.

The Kiwanis Club of Ann Arbor Board of Directors and the Children and Youth Services Committee have together budgeted \$18,000 for academic scholarships this year. In addition, the Cross Foundation has again generously agreed to "match" the individual donations of Club members. The following chart describes our financing plan.

As the chart above demonstrates, Kiwanis members will need to donate \$23,500 to fully fund the scholarship program at the \$65,000 level. 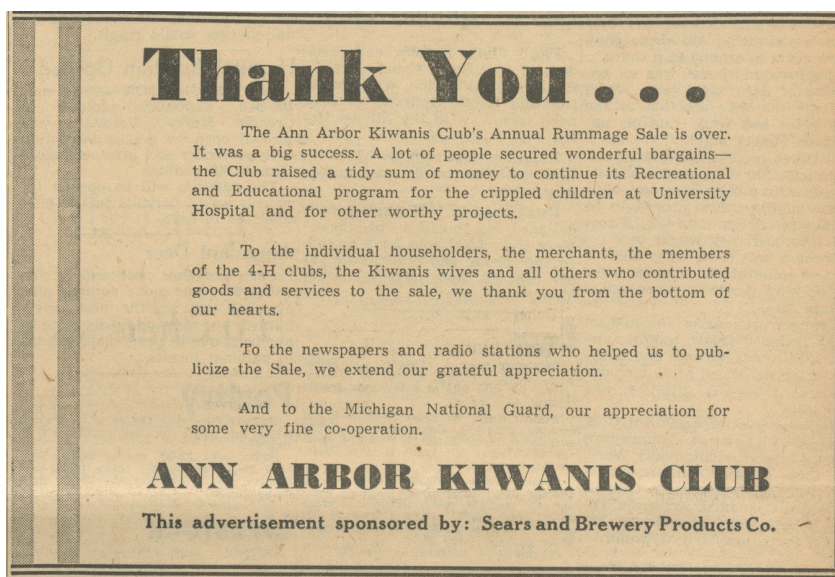
