#### TODAY'S PROGRAM...Haiti Nursing Foundation

**John Sampselle** introduced our speaker Thom Bales, Executive Director of the Haiti Nursing Foundation. Thom started by thanking our club for sponsoring his son's Cub Scout pack 131. He also acknowledged our 2018-2019 one million in sale revenue and the resulting good that

will mean for this community. The Haiti Nursing School opened in 2005. He mentioned the Ann Arbor First Presbyterian Church and Ruth Barnard as key founders. They are the only four-year nursing program in Haiti and now have started a master's degree program. Our club's last \$2500 grant went toward CPR Manikins. Thom also thanked us for five years of student sponsorship.

Thom addressed the political, social, and economic situation in

Haiti. He finds the people of Haiti very willing and able to improve their situation despite repeated natural and some manmade disasters. Currently there are protests against tax policy and missing tax revenue. They have 20% annualized inflation.

The nursing school continues Foundation. to operate but the financial

need is great. Someone has offered a \$5000 challenge grant for matching contributions from our club members and friends. Checks are payable to the Kiwanis Club of Ann Arbor Foundation (memo Haiti Nursing). All of this money will go to student sponsorship. Sponsored nurse grads pledge two years in Haiti following graduation and 90% of their nurse grads stay in Haiti. Due to a shortage of MDs, their nurses provide what we would consider primary care to their patients.
