TODAY'S PROGRAM...



Dr. Timothy Johnson


Evan LeRoy introduced Dr. Timothy Johnson, Chair of Obstetrics and Gynecology at UM Medical School, who is the President of the Southern Shores Field Service Council for the Boy Scouts of America. Southern Shores, one of four Michigan service councils, encompasses 11 counties across the southern tier of Michigan. Dr. Johnson, a long time boy scout, attained the Eagle Scout rank in 1963 while living in Virginia. When his family moved to Stockholm, Sweden, he helped establish a Boy Scout Troop at the US Embassy in Stockholm. Dr. Johnson is excited to use the leadership skills he acquired as a scout to lead Southern Shores during this transformative time for scouting.

While the mission of BSA continues to be to prepare young people to make ethical and moral choices over their lifetime by instilling in them the values of the Scout Oath and Law, clearly scouting today is not business as usual. Dr. Johnson and his team are championing leadership training especially with a STEM focus and fostering a culture of racial diversity and gender and economic inclusion. At the urging of parents who wanted their

daughters to be able to participate in the same kinds of programs as their sons, BSA opened its programming to girls. In a few short months, Southern Shores has recruited 271 girls ages 5-10 into the Cub Scout program. The Scout program for youth ages 11-17 is also open to and actively recruiting girls. Through the new HEROES program, both boys and girls are actively being recruited from populations that have been underserved by BSA in the past. These include low income and African American youth. BSA in general and the Southern Shores Field Service Council in particular are prepared to subsidize participation of scouts who are unable to afford uniforms and program and camp fees. They are also prepared to assist with transportation to program sites.

Dr. Johnson acknowledged that BSA had problems with inappropriate behavior by some adult volunteers in the past and pointed out that BSA has instituted policies and procedures

that now place it in the forefront of youth protection. With the addition of girl members and the inclusion of LGBTQ youth, additional gender based training is being provided to staff and volunteers. Dr. Johnson said Southern Shores has nearly 10,000 boy and girl scouts and over 4,000 adult volunteers. He is particularly proud that sixty-five scouts attained the Eagle Scout rank this past year. He recognized the Eagle scouts who are members of our club who were at today's meeting: Griff Dick, Larry Dittmar, Evan LeRov and Jim Meretta. He also thanked Kiwanis for its strong and continuous support of scouting through the years. He encouraged us to attend the Ann Arbor Distinguished Citizen Dinner this fall and the Second Annual Women in Scouting Recognition Event next May.


