## TODAY'S PROGRAM...

#### Women's History Month and the Girl Scouts

**President William** introduced our speaker Janice Amin, from the Girl Scouts Heart of Michigan. William mentioned that he sought out Janice, whom he knows from church, to speak during Women's History Month. Janice showed engaging slides of Girl Scouts having fun, learning leadership skills, building curiosity, connection, and the ability to take action on their own behalf and on behalf of the community at large.

Janice Amin shared many statistics... among them: all female astronauts have been Girl Scouts; five of the six female Governors elected in 2018 were Girl Scouts. All female Secretaries of State were Girl Scouts. 50% of women business owners were Girl Scouts. Less encouraging statistics: only 4% of CEO's are women; women still earn \$.79 to each man's earned \$1.00 for equal work. The amount African American women and Latina women earn is even a smaller proportion.

Janice Amin also talked about the messages from our culture that re-enforce the image and role of women as primary caregivers and homemakers whether or not they are employed outside the home. Media messages idealize beauty over character and competence. The good news is that Girl Scouts encourages girls to be all that they dream of being and provides experiences and training to help them reach their goals.

Editor's note: After the meeting, Claire Dahl shared that our club supports a special Girl Scout troop for imprisoned mothers and their daughters. They meet together at the prison and share

activities. Kiwanis provides funds for these girls to attend Girl Scout Camp like any other troop. Thought you would like to know...
