Today's Program.....

Introduced (with brevity) by **John Dahl**: Jim Cook, from the Ann Arbor Rotary Club, to explain and ask for help for Rotary International's "Polio Plus Initiative." The initiative, now in its 17th year, is working with WHO (World Health Organization), UNICEF, CDC (Centers for Disease Control), and the Gates Foundation in an effort to wipe the polio from the face of the earth. Mr. Cook said that in 1985, the year the initiative began, there were 350,000 cases of polio in the world in virtually all of the world's nations. In the fiscal year just ended, there were 350 new confirmed cases of the disease, all in three nations: Nigeria, Pakistan and Afghanistan, and the first six months of 2012, on 84 new cases have been confirmed. India, which has several cases in 2010, has no cases last year. One of the last redoubts of the virus is along the border area of Pakistan-Afghanistan, where tribal chiefs and warlords are obstructing the efforts of workers get every child vaccinated, Cooks said. Even though the vaccines only cost 60 cents per dose (Sabin, oral doses), It is estimated that another \$2 billion is needed to get the doses into the mouths of the world's remaining unprotected children, and those children still being born in Pakistan, Afghanistan, Nigeria and area close to them where it is believed that the virus could recur. Of all the money put into the project since 1985, about \$1 billion, or 15 percent of the total, has been raised by Rotary, Cook said.
