Today's Program.....

Bob Gray introduced Dr. Kim Eagle, UM School of Public Health, who presented some sobering facts about childhood obesity. Dr. Eagle first contributed a happy dollar recalling his service as President of the Bozeman, Montana Key Club a few years back. Dr. Eagle reminded us of the cardio-vascular risk factors including hypertension, smoking, high cholesterol and obesity. All of these risk factors are controlled, in part, by diet and exercise. Particularly troubling are the recent surveys of childhood obesity. There has been a 35% increase in obesity among ages 2-5 in the last ten years! Dr. Eagle says there is a toxic environment of salt, fat, and sugar along with lack of exercise that has developed in the US over the last 60 years so that most of us who are genetically predisposed to obesity are achieving that state.





He described Project Healthy Schools (PHS), which targets 6th graders (age 12), with the goals of more fruit, more exercise, less salt, less sugar, less fat and less mindless time in front of TVs and computers. This program has shown a positive impact on the several measures of cardio-vascular risk factors. Ongoing support of PHS is provided by AstraZeneca Health Care Foundation, Blue Cross Blue Shield of Michigan, The D. Dan and Betty Kahn Foundation, Memorial Healthcare Foundation, Thompson Foundation, and the University of Michigan Health system along with many other corporations, foundations, and individual donors. Dr. Eagle's presentation triggered many questions from those present.

In summary, Dr. Eagle stated that there is no denying that the diet and exercise toxic environment touches many of us but he is interested in the help provided to 35,000 middle school students in 83 schools so far along with 13,000 students in 28 middle schools in 2013-2014, one kid at a time. Bravo, Dr. Eagle.

Club Board of Directors Meeting Highlights:

- The Board endorsed the Nominating Committee recommendation of **John Schenk** for an open board position through September 30, 2014.
- The Board has endorsed a Membership Growth & Education Committee proposal to waive the first 12 months of dues for new members starting on 10/1/2013. This is a bylaw change.
- Both of the above will be put to a membership vote at the August 26th club meeting.
- Club budget: revenue is down but expense control will minimize the deficit by the
 end of the fiscal year. Foundation budget: sales are about 2% lower than budgeted
 and costs have been higher than budgeted primarily due to cost of deferred
 maintenance. However, foundation memorial gifts and investment gains will more
 than offset the added costs.
- Gordon Beeman presented the Personnel Committee recommendation to modify the employee manual reflecting the Sale Manager and Facilities Manager roles. Approved.
