In a word - Service! Actively involving members in all aspects of the Thrift Sale as well as Kiwanis SLP programs, Meals on Wheels, Warm the Children, CS Mott Child & Family Life, and other projects have enabled our Club to grow and sustain membership through service to others.

We ask. Our membership committee and individual members invite friends, colleagues, community leaders and members, grant partners, educators, and even Thrift Sale volunteers and customers.

4. What does FUN look like in your club?

We enjoy each other's' company in Thrift Sale "work", coming together for common causes, camaraderie during weekly meetings, opportunities to serve, especially with kids of all ages.

5. Anything else you'd like to share?

26 of the 28 living past presidents of the Kiwanis Club of Ann Arbor remain active members of the club and 16 achieved perfect meeting attendance in excess of 25 years to 57 years. Idealism and Good Will personified.
