CLUB HISTORY OF COMMUNITY SERVICE

The Kiwanis Club of Ann Arbor was organized on May 13, 1921, and chartered on June 13, 1921, with 60 charter members. As of October 1, 2022, the club was the largest Kiwanis club in Michigan, with 140 members (including emerita and emeritus members). Since its founding, the club has inducted 1326 members.

In 1922 the club began working with the University of Michigan Hospital to provide recreation and education for young patients. In 1934 this activity was adopted as a Michigan District project and named for Forney W. Clement, a former District Secretary and member of our club. Subsequently, the project was extended to Mary Free Bed Hospital in Grand Rapids (1961), Northern Michigan Hospitals, Inc. in Petoskey (1977), and Children's Hospital of Michigan in Detroit (1980s). Our club members make an annual gift to the Michigan District to support the Clement project at these four hospitals, and also contribute monthly to what is now known as the Child and Family Life Program at the U of M C.S. Mott Children's Hospital.

In 2017, by vote of our Board and club members, our club became the sponsoring agency for Ann Arbor Warm The Children program, with an annual commitment of \$2500.

Proceeds from rummage sales and other fund-raising efforts have enabled the club to fund the activities of many charitable organizations. Most club donations range between \$500 and \$4000. The club has made a few major gifts of \$5000 to \$25,000 to several community organizations to help support their activities.

- * collected and sent boxes of prescription eyeglasses to Third World countries
- * donated \$104,000 to the worldwide Iodine Deficiency Disorder project sponsored by KI
- * donated \$103,185 in 2015 to the Kiwanis/UNICEF worldwide ELIMINATE project to eliminate maternal and neonatal tetanus.
- * donated over \$112,000 since 2010 to the Haiti Nursing Foundation to fund student scholarships to the Faculty of Nursing Science of the Episcopal University of Haiti.

CLUB MEMBERSHIP

Those who join our club are invited to join by current members. The weekly, Monday-noon meetings are an excellent forum for prospective members to meet club members. The club covers the cost of two meals for each prospective member.

Members who wish to sponsor prospective members ask them to fill out and sign a Membership Application form. Sponsors sign the form and return it to the Club Secretary. The Secretary arranges for information about the applicant to be published in two consecutive issues of the Club Newsletter and forwards the completed application to the facilitator of the Past Presidents, who arranges for the applicant to be interviewed by a Past President.

After an interviewer recommends acceptance of the application, the Club Secretary submits the application to the Club Board of Directors for approval. After the Board's approval, the Secretary notifies the applicant and requests payment of dues. Upon payment of dues, the Secretary places a new-member badge in the badge rack, and the President schedules a formal induction ceremony, with the applicant and sponsor present.

Annual club dues for 2022-2023 are \$180. Sponsors mentor new members to help them complete their orientation into the club and earn a regular-member badge. New members qualify for the regular-member badge once they:

- submit a digital photo of themselves or have their picture taken by the club photographer
- write a brief biography (100-200 words) to be published in Newsletter
- volunteer to help with the Thrift Sale
- join a club or foundation committee
- give a 3-minute speech about themselves at a club meeting
- participate in two additional club activities, such as:
 - greet guests and members at a noon meeting
 - attend a Board meeting
 - attend an interclub
- participate in at least one Kiwanis-sponsored community activity, such as:
 - Warm the Children program
 - Salvation Army bell ringing
 - Meals on Wheels delivery



How To Maintain Perfect Attendance

A member who chooses to maintain perfect attendance can do so by attending all regularly scheduled club meetings or by making up missed meetings. One member-participation credit may be earned for personal attendance at the following meetings or activities during the calendar month or 7 days immediately preceding or following the month that a club meeting is missed:

- a regular, round-table, Board, or special meeting of any other Kiwanis-family club
- a regular (not a special) meeting of our club's Board of Directors
- a regular, scheduled meeting of one of our club's formal committees
- a service project of our club or of a Kiwanis-family organization sponsored by our club (maximum of 1 credit/day/project)
- an international, district, or division Board meeting, convention, conference, or scheduled meeting (maximum of 1 credit per event)
- a club function held to improve the health, welfare, morale, or esprit de corps of club members (maximum of 1 credit/month)
- absence from a regular club meeting as a result of travel to or from an international or district convention or conference (travel must be within 7 days before or after the event)
- a visit to the international office, a regional service center, or a district office (maximum of 1 credit/quarter)
- one credit is given for each regular meeting missed as a result of performing jury duty

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The Kiwanis Center

The evolution of the Kiwanis Center from its original downtown location on the southwest corner of First and Washington Streets to the new Kiwanis Center at 100 North Staebler Road is a tribute to the foresight and dedication to community service by the members and volunteers of the Kiwanis Club of Ann Arbor.

On April 11, 1966, the club voted unanimously to purchase the distinct beige, brick warehouse and flour mill at 200 S. First St., which once housed the Swisher Wholesale Grocery Store and then the Sears Roebuck & Co. Farm Store. The purchase was made possible through the generosity of John E. Swisher, Jr., whose father was a past president of the club (1925), and through contributions from club members and people in the local community. The club named the building the Kiwanis Activities Center (KAC). In 2015, following the purchase of an additional facility, Kiwanis Center West (KCW), the KAC was renamed the Kiwanis Center Downtown (KCD). The new KCW opened on June 13, 2015, for Saturday sales. Later that year sales were expanded to include Fridays and Saturdays from 9 am to 1 pm. In September 2016, the club membership voted to authorize the Board of Directors to consider proposals for the sale of KCD. In 2017, the club accepted an offer to sell KCD, with the closing taking place in January of 2018. All club activities were relocated to KCW by December 31, 2017, at which time KCW was renamed the Kiwanis Center.



The Kiwanis Activity Center — 1966-2017

The Kiwanis Center at 100 North Staebler Rd is a 123,000 sq-ft office and warehouse building on a 17.4-acre lot. Approximately 71,000 square feet of the building is dedicated to Kiwanis purposes, including the Kiwanis Thrift Sale; Kiwanis offices and meeting rooms; intake, sorting, and warehousing of donated sale items; plus maintenance and utilities. The remaining 52,000 square feet is warehouse and office space rented to other users. Seven and one-half acres of undeveloped wetlands and woods

on the property have been designated as the Ann Arbor Kiwanis Environmental Education Preserve (A2KEEP). That project is under development and will include ponds, woodland, and marsh areas interwoven by paths and planned display projects. Another 2.5-acre portion of the property fronting on Jackson Road is being offered for sale as a commercial out lot. An additional 3.8-acre property, with two buildings, immediately adjacent to the north of the Kiwanis Center property was purchased in October of 2022. Plans for this property include employee and volunteer parking, and enhancement of the A2KEEP project.

Having our Kiwanis Thrift Sale operating again out of one location has allowed for a better shopping experience for our customers and for much improved efficiency in the receiving, sorting, and presenting of merchandise by our club members, volunteers, and staff.



LEGION OF HONOR

Kiwanis International established the Legion of Honor in 1944 as a way for local Kiwanis clubs to recognize members who have served their communities through Kiwanis for 25 years or more. 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2021–22 Kiwanis Thrift Sale Takes in \$1.3 Million

During FY 2021-22, revenue from the Kiwanis Thrift Sale totaled \$1,376,000 from sales at the 48 weekly Thrift Sales. Weekly (Monday-Saturday) revenue averaged \$24,700. By far, the largest portion of these revenues are generated on Friday and Saturday Thrift-Sale days, but some items are purchased by sale workers during the week. In FY 2021-22, there was a total of 47,374 transactions: 19,943 in cash and 27,431 on credit-card (CC) purchases. The average cash transaction was \$19.38 and the average CC transaction was \$36.09. In these transactions, a total of 348,400 items were sold. The average number of items sold per week was 7,258. The average cost of all items sold was \$3.95.

Our point-of-sale data show that, last year, each of our many departments sold over 4,000 items. The top five departments in number of items sold were: Clothing—80,051 items; Books/CD/Records—60,712 items; Housewares—60,208 items; Crafts—25,792 items; and Toys—21,118 items. Data for net sales by department show the top five departments in terms of net revenue were: Clothing—\$298,023; Furniture—\$172,655; Housewares—\$139,602; Jewelry—\$116,906; and Books/CD/Rec—\$69,438.

Volunteers and KC staff provide the staffing for the Thrift Sale operations. During the 2021-22 year, a total of 39,897 volunteer hours were logged: 23,223 hours by non-member volunteers and 16,668 hours by club-member volunteers. The average hours per month provided by non-member volunteers was 1,936; the average hours per month provided by member volunteers was 1,389. The monthly average number of non-member sale workers was 101 and for member sale workers, it was 61. Without all these volunteers, we could not conduct the Kiwanis Thrift Sale.

Kiwanis Donations to the Haiti Nursing Foundation Surpass \$100,000

Since 2010, the Kiwanis Club of Ann Arbor Foundation, with additional support from the Ray and Eleanor Cross Foundation and individual club members, has made annual donations to the Haiti Nursing Foundation to be used for scholarship funds for students attending the Faculty of Nursing Science of the Episcopal University of Haiti. As of 2022, these donations total over \$112,000.

At the Haiti Nursing Foundation's annual dinner, held on October 22, 2022, at the Ann Arbor City Club, Thom Bales, Executive Director of the Haiti Nursing Foundation, presented Kiwanis club president, Steve Hiller, with a commemorative plaque honoring our club's "over 100 years of service supporting children and youth in our community and around the world."



ZELLER FELLOWS

In 2011 Kiwanis International (KI) established the Walter Zeller Fellowship to commemorate Walter Zeller, who made the first gift of 25 silver dollars to establish the KI Foundation. The Zeller Fellowship recognizes a gift of at least \$1,250 to the ELIMINATE Project, an undertaking to raise \$110 million by 30 September 2015 to eliminate maternal neonatal tetanus in mothers and newborns in countries where this disease remains a threat.

On 22 August 2011, our Club membership pledged to donate \$100,000 to the KI worldwide ELIMINATE Project by 30 September 2015, a goal we met and exceeded by raising \$103,185. 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2022–2023 Kiwanis Club Scholarship Program Washtenaw Community College Scholarships

On October, 10, 2022, the KCAA Foundation presented a check for \$88,450 to the Washtenaw Community College Foundation in support of scholarships and financial assistance to students who have graduated from high schools in the Washtenaw Community College residential district or currently reside within that district. The presentation was made at a celebratory luncheon held at the Morris Lawrence Building on the WCC campus.

Funding for this program comes from the KCAA Foundation and from the donations of individual club members and Kiwanis volunteers. The WCCF administers the funds Kiwanis donates. Individual scholarships are awarded for amounts up to \$3,500 each year. The scholarships cover a student's expenses for tuition, books, and fees for that entire year. The program also includes a \$2,000 donation to the WCC Student Emergency Fund, which helps support students who experience unexpected financial hardships that threaten their ability to continue their education.

Kiwanis calls its scholarship program "The Finish Line" because, once a student is selected to participate, their scholarship continues until they achieve their Associates Degree or until they transfer to a four-year college or university.

Four of our 2022-23 Kiwanis Scholars attended the scholarship-award luncheon and received their Kiwanis Scholarship certificates. They appear on the cover of this *Digest*. 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CLUB AND FOUNDATION FUNDRAISING AND GIVING

The Kiwanis Club of Ann Arbor began raising money in 1925 by selling newspapers. In 1927 it teamed with King's Daughters, a local church guild, to hold periodic three-day rummage sales in vacant stores and, from 1948 to 1967, in the National Guard Armory. From February 1968 through 1990, sales were held in the Kiwanis Center Downtown (KCD) periodically, thence weekly on Saturday mornings. In January of 2012, through the generosity of Don Butcher, a former club member, and Jake Haas, the club acquired temporary use of an 8000-sq-ft warehouse at 840 Airport Plaza Dr. in which to store and sell furniture and other large items. Then, in 2014, the club's Foundation purchased a 17.4-acre lot, including a warehouse and office complex, located at 100 North Staebler Road, which became the Kiwanis Center West (KCW). In October 2022, the Foundation's members voted to purchase an additional connecting property of 3.8 acres with two buildings for future uses. Regular Saturday sales began at KCW on June 13, 2015. Sale of the KCD building was completed in January 2018. Since then, all our Kiwanis activities, including the Thrift Sale, have been held at the Kiwanis Center (KC, previously KCW) at 100 North Staebler Road. Currently, the Kiwanis Thrift Sale is open 50 weeks of the year at KC from 9 AM to 1 PM on Fridays and Saturdays.

Kiwanis Thrift Sale merchandise comes from individuals or organizations who drop off items at KC, and through the pickup service that the club's charitable foundation provides. Club members, volunteers, and employees then sort, price, display, and sell donated items. This work often requires conscientious sorting, creative merchandising, and tact. A sorter once found \$660 in an article of clothing; occasionally bills are found hidden in books. Items sold include automobiles, store mannequins, live piglets, tombstones, boats, and organs (musical). Once, four people bought the same sofa on the same day and showed up simultaneously to claim it. Someone mistakenly donated a neighbor's dishes. Members and volunteers have had their own coats and jackets inadvertently sold during a sale. The most successful single sale, a three-day event in 1985, grossed \$80,234. Between fiscal years 2006-07 and 2021-22, annual gross sales have increased from \$241,000 to over \$1,341,000.

Over the years the club's foundation has found additional ways to raise funds. It sells donated vehicles through a licensed dealer. It began selling selected items on eBay in 2002 and on craigslist in 2011.

Since 1927, the club and its charitable foundation (formed in 1964) have netted many millions of dollars from our Thrift Sales. The foundation devotes these net proceeds to supporting many projects of charitable organizations that serve the local community and Washtenaw County. The success of the Kiwanis Foundation Thrift Sale depends on the hard work of many club members and more than 100 volunteers.

In addition to donating money to charitable organizations, the foundation gives merchandise to individuals and families in need through two Direct Assistance Programs. One program is operated by the Sales Management Oversight Committee, which, in 2021-22, provided \$338,356 in direct giving. The club's Community Services Committee administers a second direct assistance program, the Voucher Program, in cooperation with participating local social agencies. In fiscal year 2021-22, the Voucher Committee distributed \$66,455 worth of merchandise to more than 292 qualified clients of social agencies that serve the greater Ann Arbor community. The foundation has also donated clothing to people in need worldwide, especially to orphanages and countries that have suffered natural disasters. Annually, the Kiwanis Thrift Sale's book department donates thousands of surplus children's books to teachers and libraries of K-12 schools in the Ann Arbor area and Detroit.

The club's foundation, together with contributions from club members and others, also awards academic scholarships and camperships to deserving area youth. In 2021-22, these awards totaled \$88,450 for 27 full-ride academic scholarships to Washtenaw Community College students. Since 2010, the KCAA Foundation, with support from club members and the Ray and Eleanor Cross Foundation, has also donated over \$112,000 in scholarship funds to the Faculty of Nursing Science of the Episcopal University of Haiti.

In July of 2017, the foundation assumed sponsorship of the Warm the Children program of Washtenaw County. In 2021-22, our club raised and disbursed \$99,887 for winter clothing for 1,100 children.

Through all these programs combined, the club and foundation have donated over \$9.1 million in money and merchandise to charities and individuals since the club's inception in 1921.

HIXSON FELLOWS

Kiwanis International (KI) established the George F. Hixson Fellowship in 1983 to honor its first president. Fellows are selected in one of two ways. First, members of a club, upon making a lump-sum payment of at least \$1000 to the KI Foundation, may designate recipients during their lifetimes or posthumously. Second, a club itself may designate a recipient (e.g., a club member or her/his spouse) by making a lump-sum payment of at least \$1000 to the KI Foundation.

To be considered for a Hixson Fellowship sponsored by our club, a member must demonstrate exceptional dedication to the club and its Objects during the course of a single year. This may be achieved in various ways, such as excellence as chair of a committee, outstanding success in recruiting, extraordinary involvement by a new member, or other comparable contributions to the club. In exceptional circumstances, the club may award a Fellowship to a nonmember, provided that the designee has made a contribution to the community commensurate with the club's standards for Honorary Member status or has made a singular contribution of time and effort to the club.

During three administrative years (1996-1999), our club donated a total of \$104,000 to KI for the Worldwide Iodine Deficiency Disorder program. In 2015, we donated an additional \$103,000 to KI for the KIWANIS/UNICEF ELIMINATE project to eliminate maternal and neonatal tetanus. Consequently, KI has extended to our club the privilege of awarding several dozen Hixson Fellowships. Upon the recommendation of the Member Recognition Committee and approval by the Board, the names of Fellows are permanently displayed in the Kiwanis Center. GENERAL CHARGES TO CLUB AND FOUNDATION COMMITTEES

Kiwanis Club of Ann Arbor committees are either committees of the Club (C), committees of the Foundation (F), or two separate committees of the Club and of the Foundation respectively (C&F).

Archive (C&F): Locates, discovers, organizes, and archives the past, present and future records, photos, memorabilia, and stories of our Club and Foundation. Identifies effective means to safeguard and search the archives.

Attendance & Reception (C): Tabulates member attendance and organizes members to greet other members, guests, and visitors as they arrive for noon meetings. Introduces guests and visitors to the attendees.

Building & Equipment (F): Oversees the maintenance, planning, safety, and security of the Kiwanis Center building, equipment, facilities, and vehicles.

Bylaws (C&F): Reviews and recommends changes to the Club and Foundation bylaws. Updates the Club and Foundation Manuals of Administrative Policies and Procedures as appropriate.

Children & Youth Services (F): Initiates projects that benefit children and youth from birth to age 18, and grants funds to organizations that serve them. Awards college, music, and summer camperships.

Club Budget & Finance (C): Develops annual budgets and quarterly updates for the Club. Presents the budget and updates to the Club Board.

Community Services (F): Oversees the Foundation's Direct Assistance Program. The Grants division funds a variety of community projects; the Vouchers division helps clients and case managers redeem vouchers for Thrift Sale merchandise.

Ethics (C&F): Develops a Code of Conduct for all volunteers, members, and those interacting with Kiwanis that includes specific guidelines for behavior and a set of required procedures for addressing occurrences of inappropriate behavior in a timely fashion. Coordinates with Personnel Committee with respect to employees

Fines & Happy Dollars (C): Monitors, organizes, and proposes Fines and Happy Dollars and encourages all members to do so at our noon meetings. Collects and counts Fines and Happy Dollars and reports those totals to the Club Treasurer.

Foundation Budget & Finance (F): Develops annual budgets and quarterly updates for the Foundation. Presents the budget and updates to the Foundation Board.

Grant Coordination (F): Oversees and administers the Foundation's grant-application process. Facilitates disbursements of grants.

Greater Years (F): Initiates projects and grants that benefit seniors. Grants funds to agencies that serve the senior community.

Honorary Members and Honored Volunteers Selection (C&F): Nominates worthy community-minded citizens who exemplify the ideals of Kiwanis to become Honorary Members of the Club. Oversees the annual induction ceremony for Honorary Members and Honored Volunteers.

Hospitality (C): Informs membership about births, deaths, illnesses, accidents, and hospitalizations that involve current and past members and volunteers and their families. Sends cards or flowers as appropriate.

Human & Spiritual Values (F): Oversees and administers grants that center on spiritual value and human comfort. Oversees the Salvation Army bell-ringing project. Schedules weekly invocation presenters.

Interclubs (C): Encourages our Club's exchange visits to other Kiwanis clubs. Ensures that our Club completes one interclub each month, including super interclubs.

Investment Oversight (C&F): Manages the invested reserve funds of the Club and the Foundation.

Kiwanis Environment Education Preserve (KEEP) (F): Develops, oversees, and maintains the environmental preserve at the Kiwanis Center.

GENERAL CHARGES TO CLUB AND FOUNDATION COMMITTEES, *continued*

Kiwanis of Michigan Foundation (C&F): Informs Club members about the role of KMF in serving children who are patients at the four children's hospitals supported by KMF.

Meals on Wheels (C): In conjunction with the U of M MOW program, delivers meals to the frail, elderly, and disabled Monday through Friday throughout the year.

Member Recognition (C): Provides appropriate recognition to members whose contributions have helped the Club achieve its Kiwanis objectives. Oversees attendance and member-award ceremonies.

Membership Digest (C): Prepares and arranges for the publication of the annual Membership Digest.

Membership Growth & Education (C): Develops and implements strategies to recruit, orient, introduce, support, and retain Club members.

Newsletter (C): Prepares the weekly (online) Club Newsletter for distribution to Club members, volunteers and friends of Kiwanis.

Nominating (C&F): Nominates officers (except Secretaries) and Directors to stand for annual election. Prepares and counts ballots for the Club's and Foundation's annual meeting.

Operations Coordination (F): Coordinates the work of the Sale Management Oversight Committee and the Building & Equipment Committee with respect to the activities and needs of tenants renting space in the Kiwanis Center.

Outreach (C&F): Promotes membership and volunteerism for our club by bringing community groups to the Kiwanis Center to hear presentations about the Club's mission and to familiarize them with our Thrift Sale; conducts other community outreach activities.

Personnel (F): Develops, implements, and monitors personnel policies of Foundation, subject to the approval by the respective Board.

Programs (C): Secures speakers for noon meetings and arranges for members to introduce speakers.

Public Relations & Marketing (C&F): Communicates the mission, vision, activities, and programs of our Club and Foundation to members, volunteers, and the public through on-line and print media. Takes photographs at Club meetings and events for use in the Newsletter and the Membership Digest, and for other Club needs. Oversees and coordinates our Thrift Sale, Club, and Foundation web pages.

Real Estate (F): Investigates opportunities to acquire, rent, or dispose of real estate for the benefit of the Foundation. Negotiates terms of ensuing transactions, subject to requirements set by the Bylaws, in coordination with the Building & Equipment Committee and the Sale Management Oversight Committee.

Risk Management (F): Provides periodic reviews (at least annually) of our building, property, and operations; makes recommendations and oversees the implementation of risk management best practices, proper insurance coverage, and security systems; develops, identifies, and reviews the role of the Safety Officer.

Sale Management Oversight (F): Develops policies and implements procedures for managing all aspects of the Thrift Sale.

Service Leadership Programs (C): Oversees the maintenance and growth of K-Kids, Builders, Key, Circle K, and Aktion Clubs.

Scholarship (F): Provides financial scholarships to high school graduates in furtherance of their completion of a college or technical degree.

Social (C): Plans and implements periodic social events that foster camaraderie among Club members, volunteers, friends, and families.

Technology (C&F): Identifies and evaluates, technology needs to support Club and Foundation activities. Develops and makes recommendations for continual improvement.
